

A national program that provides a free trip for WWII and Korean War Veterans to Washington D.C. twice a year.

Purpose is to see WWII, Korean War, Iwo Jima and other War Memorials.

W Virginia Wounded Warrior Program (VWWP)

Coordinates support services for veterans with stress-related and traumatic bran injuries resulting from service in a combat area. The program ensures these veterans and their families receive timely assessment, treatment, and support.

W Services

- Regional coalitions of community service boards, brain injury service providers are offering service across Virginia. Examples of services:
 - Assessments

✓ Outpatient Services

✓ Family Support

- ✓ Rehabilitative Services (e.g. Equi-Vets)
- ✓ Case Management
- ✓ Linkage to housing/education prgms

III Key Issues

- Military service members/families unfamiliar with services
 - ✓ VWWP provides connectivity
- Virginia Gen Assy provides some but not enough funding for services.
 - ✓ Additional support comes from individuals, Veteran Service Orgs and private sector.
 - ✓ All contributions directly serve program participants, not admin costs.









w Pocket Field Pillow

Provides a small, denim covered pillows that fit in BDU trousers side pocket for soldiers in combat zones.

Volunteers make the pillows.

✓ Funds are used to transport the pillows to the combat

units.

Only piece of the Community Affairs Program that directly supports soldiers in combat.













Equi-Vets

- Program for Wounded Warriors and their families to physically and mentally reconnect through equine activities.
- NO cost to participants


W Program
