Fellow Officers and Spouses:

## **The Veterans Service Foundation**

The Veterans Service Foundation (VSF) is an independent state agency that supports veterans and their families through the Virginia Department of Veterans Services' (DVS) programs and services. The Foundation accepts donations to support critical programs and services for Virginia's veterans and their families that are not covered by state or federal funds. These services include: Virginian Veteran and Family Support, Veterans Care Centers, Virginia Veteran Cemeteries, Veterans Benefit Program, and the Virginia Values Veterans Fund.

At the last two meetings of the Virginia Council of Chapter (VCOC) there have been discussions regarding the VSF and their expenditures. Specifically, it's make up and questions concerning its finances related to income and expenditures. The VCOC has taken action to invite VSF representatives to come talk to the VCOC and report back to chapters. This meeting is scheduled for the fall session. ### SURVIVING SPOUSE CORNER

#### Military Health Care Update

When servicemembers and dependents turn 65 and they enroll in Medicare, they also will become eligible for TRICARE For Life (TFL). No fees are associated with TFL, however, beneficiaries must pay the Medicare Part B premiums to stay enrolled in TFL. TFL works as the secondary payer to Medicare; Medicare pays 80 percent of covered services, and TFL pays the remaining 20 percent. TFL also pays the Medicare deductible. Generally, beneficiaries should not have any out-of-pocket costs for Medicare and TRICARE-covered services.

Under provisions of the FY 2017 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), TRICARE benefit plans for servicemembers and dependents under age 65 will be streamlined from three plan types to two. TRICARE Select is the new preferred provider option; it will replace TRICARE Standard. The new TRICARE Select will have an Extra-like network of TRICARE providers who will have agreed to accept a pre-negotiated rate of payment. The other option is TRICARE Prime. It will be modernized so the majority of referrals to specialists from primary care managers will no longer be required to through a pre-authorization process.

TRICARE also has new preventive care coverage, including the Cologuard colorectal cancer screening exam and BRCA1 or BRCA2 gene testing for breast cancer. For children and families, TRICARE's benefit coverage will be consistent with the American Academy of Pediatrics' standards of care of well children over age 6. Beneficiaries using TRICARE Standard no longer will pay cost shares for well-child screening and preventive visits. Learn more about the new preventive care coverage on MOAA's website.

Regarding pharmacy changes, TRICARE Pharmacy contractor, Express Scripts, announced CVS pharmacies no longer would process prescriptions as of Dec. 1, 2016. Instead, Walgreens pharmacies returned to the TRICARE network. Beneficiaries who had been using CVS should have been notified how they could transfer their prescriptions to a nearby network pharmacy. You can find your closest TRICARE network pharmacy using the Express Scripts website.

The FY 2017 NDAA also included a provision that would allow dependents of retired members to purchase hearing aids at-cost. MOAA is working closely with DoD's TRICARE department on this benefit and likely will have updates in a few months.

## Military ID Card Notification Program

This voluntary program is designed to help Chapter members and their dependent's to renew their ID cards in a timely fashion. Once you and your dependents are enrolled, you will be notified of your impending ID card expiration date in sufficient time for renewal prior to the expiration date.

To enroll by mail: make copies of the form below for each dependent and fill out the required information. Mail to Military ID Card Notification Program, HRCMOAA, PO Box 4612, Virginia Beach, VA 23454-0612.

To enroll by email: visit our website, www.hrcmoaa.org and click on About Our Chapter and the ID Card Notification Program link and follow the instructions.

Note: Over age 75 members, who are eligible uniform family members and survivors of deceased personnel are now eligible for Permanent Identification Cards. Apply within 90 days of expiration of current ID card.

### February 24th Luncheon



On February 24th at the Virginia Beach Resort Hotel & Conference Center were joined by guest speakers Michelle Banks and Jenise Wilcox for a discussion on Delta Dental and TRICARE.

Michelle Banks, the Southeast regional marketing and communications representative for Delta Dental of California, Federal Government Programs discussed the TRICARE Retiree Dental Program (TRDP). Some topics of discussion were comprehensive, cost -effective dental coverage, enrollment is voluntary and premiums are required. The TRDP, authorized by Congress as part of the National Defense Authorization Act for fiscal year 1997, offers affordable dental benefits as a voluntary option to the nation's 5 million-plus Uniformed Services retirees and their family members. With current enrollment of more than 1.3 million, the TRDP is the nation's largest voluntary, allenrollee-paid dental program.

Ms. Jenise Wilcox, Supervisor Branch Health Clinic Norfolk (Sewell's Point) discussed TRICARE. Some topics discussed were (but not limited to): Eligibility, DOD ID card and DEERS Registration, HBA Function, Outpatient and Inpatient Care, Other Health Insurance, Specialty Care, Pharmacy Benefits, Dental Care and TRICARE Benefits.

Both Ms. Banks and Ms. Wilcox answered questions for our members. Pictured above is HRCMOAA President MG John McLaren, USA (ret) with Ms. Banks and Ms. Wilcox after he presented them both with Jefferson Cups.

Our chapter welcomed CAPT Lanny L. Boswell, USN, Commanding Officer, United States Naval Hospital ship, USNS COMFORT. CAPT Boswell gave a very interesting brief where he discussed COMFORT's various missions.

<u>Primary</u>: Military Combat Operations- Surgical Trauma Center Afloat. COMFORT supports forward deployed Navy elements of the fleet and fleet activities, amphibious task forces, Marine Corps, Army, and Air Force elements.

<u>Secondary</u>: Urgent Disaster Response - Acute Care. In addition to her primary mission of supporting military combat operations, she supports U.S. Government agencies involved in foreign/domestic disaster relief in peacetime military operations.

<u>Tertiary</u>: Large scale Humanitarian Assistance - Medical Center. Along with supporting both military combat and peacetime operations, COMFORT has a very important third mission. She supports U.S. Government agencies involved in humanitarian assistance or limited humanitarian care incident to mission in peacetime military operations.



USNS COMFORT is a converted San Clemente Class Oil Tanker and was built in 1976. The conversion to hospital ship begun in 1984 and was commissioned in 1987 with her first deployment commencing in August 1990 for Desert Shield/Desert Storm.

The Medical Treatment Facility aboard the MERCY Class Hospital Ship is one of the largest trauma facilities in the United States and offers a full spectrum of surgical and medical services.

Patients arrive aboard by helicopter and occasionally by small boat, especially if operating near shore. With 1,000 total hospital beds and 12 operating rooms, a huge variety of medical services are available onboard. Surgical capabilities include cardiac and thoracic, ear/nose/throat, neurosurgery, ophthalmic, obstetric and gynecology, orthopedic, dental, plastic, maxillofacial, and urology. Additionally, non-surgical capabilities include internal medicine, dialysis, respiratory therapy, dermatology, psychiatry, and angiography.




