



Legislative Affairs: Virginia Council of Chapters Holds 34th Annual Congressional Awards Luncheon

The Virginia Council of Chapters (VCOC) held the 34th Annual Congressional Awards Luncheon at the Capitol Hill Club, DC on 9 May 2018. The primary purpose of the luncheon was to present the VCOC Legislator of the Year Award. This year, Congressman Rob Wittman (R-1) was the VCOC awardee.

During his speech, Congressman Wittman, Chairman of the Armed Services Subcommittee on Seapower and Projection Forces, emphasized the critical need to rebuild our Armed Services in order to meet today's threats. In particular, he highlighted the urgent need to grow the United States Navy to 355 ships at the earliest possible date.

All of the members emphasized the need for a strong Defense, thanking MOAA National and all chapters nationwide for an eternal vigilance and unending reminder for such need.

Also in attendance at the luncheon were 17 members of the MOAA Staff, including President Lt. Gen. Dana Atkins, USAF (Ret). During the luncheon Gen. Atkins provided an update regarding the move of MOAA National Headquarters to an interim location, pending renovation of the current MOAA building on North Washington Street in Alexandria.

Community Affairs - NROTC Commissioning Ceremonies

Old Dominion University (ODU); Spring Army and Naval Service ROTC Commissioning; May 4, 2018 CAPT Mike Barea, USN (Ret)

The US Army's ODU Monarch Battalion, commanded by Lieutenant Colonel (LTC) Michael Warren, USA commissioned eight Second Lieutenants in the US Army, Army National Guard and Army Reserves. The Hampton Roads NROTC Unit, commanded by Captain Lennie E. Reed, USN is a consortium comprised of four universities and a community college; Old Dominion University, Norfolk State University, Regent University, Hampton University and Tidewater Community College. The Naval Service ROTC Unit commissioned 28 Ensigns in the Navy and one Second Lieutenant in the United States Marine Corps. A total of 37 students were developed morally, mentally, physically and were imbued with the highest ideals of duty, honor, and loyalty in order to commission college graduates as military officers who possess a basic professional background, are motivated toward careers in the military, and have a potential for future development in mind and character so as to assume the highest responsibilities of command, citizenship and government. Opening remarks were provided by University Representatives and the ceremony was honored to have, as its guest speaker, RDML Jesse A. Wilson, USN, Commander Naval Surface Force Atlantic who pro-

vided keynote remarks and issued the Oath of Office.

RDML Wilson, USN, is a Naval Academy graduate. He received a B.S. in Mathematics a M.S. in Operations Research at Post-graduate School Monterey, California and M.A. in National Security and Strategic Studies at the Naval War College, Newport, Rhode Island. Additionally, RDML Wilson is a Massachusetts Institute of Technology Seminar Fellow and is a graduate of the Navy Corporate Business Course at University of Virginia-Darden. He commanded numerous surface combatant units and most recently commanded Carrier Strike Group 10, USS DWIGHT D EISENHOWER (CVN 69) Carrier Strike Group during a combat deployment leading them during Operation Inherent Resolve, Operation Odyssey Resolve and Operations Oaken Steel in the Arabian Gulf and eastern Mediterranean Sea.

Note: Over age 75 members, who are eligible uniform family members and survivors of deceased personnel are now eligible for Permanent Identification Cards. Apply within 90 days of expiration of current ID card.
