October HRCMOAA Luncheon



Michelle S. Banks, Southeast Region Marketing Representative - Federal Government Programs, will be our guest speaker for our October luncheon. On October 19th, she will discuss the TRI-CARE Retiree Dental Program (TRDP) end-of-year "sun-setting" and enrollment in the Federal Employees Dental and Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIP). The first opportunity to enroll in FEDVIP will be during the next Federal Benefits Open Season, which runs

from November 12 through December 10, 2018 with coverage effective January 1, 2019.

It is very important to ensure EVERYONE gets the word that the Retiree Dental Program as it exists today will be going away December 31, 2018. Delta Dental's TRDP becomes one of the options under the FEDVIP Insurance menu of options effective January 1, 2019. Current enrollees in TRDP will not automatically be rolled into the new program. You must re-enroll via the open season period to have coverage under the new program.

Retirees must enroll for dental insurance of some sort (Delta Dental Retiree Plan or some other) via the open season November 12th - December 10th (or via some other commercial dental insurance). If not you will not have dental insurance coverage as of January 1, 2019.

This is one not to miss as we must all make a choice!

Fellow Officers and Spouses,

I hope some of our members have had a chance to read an enlightening article in the August Military Officer magazine on the impacts of changes to the Thrift Savings Plan (TSP), enacted under the TSP Modernization Act of 2017. The article is found on page 26 of the August MOAA magazine. In summary the Act outlines the specification on which TSP account monies can be withdrawn, what distributions may be made, and offers options on switching to different preferred withdrawal plans. In addition, the Act places some restrictions on post-separation withdrawals, age-based withdrawals, partial post-separation withdrawals, and requires a declaration to state which approved withdrawal plan you might be using. Codification of all of these many choices for your TSP is going to take time and the policies and procedures are not yet set into stone. Please keep checking the MOAA National site for future updates on the details of the TSP Modernization Act of 2017.

At the end of August, I had the opportunity to commission new Army officers at Old Dominion University ROTC unit. In the crowd were current cadets and new cadets to the ODU program. I have to say they were a group of dedicated and committed young men and women. What a pleasure it is to know that the future of our nations defense is such good hands.





Fall Legislative Affairs Update

On the local scene, Fall 2018 has been active for our Chapter Legislative Affairs. On the national scene, MOAA continues to tirelessly advocate for our nations veterans. This noted, the purpose of the following article is twofold. First, briefly highlight our chapter Legislative Affairs activity. Next, spotlight the "Blue Water Navy" issue, now before Congress.

Chapter Legislator of the Year



During our September Luncheon, Virginia Secretary of Veterans and Defense Affairs Dr. Carlos Hopkins spoke to our chapter. Dr. Hopkins is a graduate of The Citadel, serving as a doctor in the U.S. Army for eight years, treating soldiers wounded in Operation Desert Storm. Secretary Hopkins noted the veteran population in Virginia to be numbering 777,000, about 12% per cent of the state population. Secretary Hopkins emphasized the critical need for both the health care and proactive hiring of this population of Veterans in the Commonwealth. Subsequent to the Secretary's presentation, MOAA Hampton Roads President MG John McLaren (USA, Ret.) presented Legislator of the Year for both the Federal and State levels in Virginia. This chapter level award recognizes legislators at both the local and federal level for outstanding and dedicated service to the citizens, military and families of Virginia and our nation. For 2018, Representative Scott Taylor (R-2nd) and Delegate Jason Miyares (R-82nd) were the awardees.

Amidst receiving their awards, both briefly spoke, thanked veterans for their service and our chapter for the recognition. Congressman Taylor said, "What an incredible honor it is to be awarded the Hampton Roads Military Officers Association of America's Congressional Legislator of the Year. Thank you for all that you do for veterans and active duty military!"

Note: Over age 75 members, who are eligible uniform family members and survivors of deceased personnel are now eligible for Permanent Identification Cards. Apply within 90 days of expiration of current ID card.

Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2017

On 11 September 2018, MOAA issued a press release entitled, "Blue Water Navy Veterans Face Setback From the VA." Referring to the exposure of Vietnam Veterans to the herbicide Agent Orange, MOAA remains committed to advocating for the **Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2017**, which would extend benefits available to Blue Water Navy veterans of the Vietnam War.

History

Over a ten year period from 1961-1971, the United States military conducted an operation known as **Ranch Hand** in Vietnam. Over 20 million gallons of herbicide were dispersed in Vietnam, Laos and Cambodia. The purpose of the operation was to eradicate forest cover and food crops utilized by North Vietnamese troops. Agent Orange contains Dioxin, a known carcinogen.

The Federal Government's response to Agent Orange exposure in Vietnam has been one of steady progress, amidst both outrage and ensuing lawsuits among Vietnam Veterans. In example, President George H.W. Bush signed into law in 1991 the Agent Orange Act, mandating that diseases associated with Agent Orange be treated due to wartime service. This legislation greatly solidified the Veteran's Administration future response to those veterans exposed to Agent Orange during the Vietnam Conflict.

Most Recent Legislation

Moving to 2018, House Resolution 229, **Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2017**, sponsored by Representative David Valadao (R-CA-21), "includes as part of the Republic of Vietnam its territorial seas for purposes of the presumption of service connection for diseases associated with exposure by veterans to certain herbicide agents while in Vietnam."

In a recent letter to the Senate Veteran's Affairs Committee, Veterans Affairs Secretary Robert Wilkie debated the validity of H.R. 229, including "taking issue with the cost of the legislation." To cover the costs associated with the legislation, the bill would raise \$1.1 billion over 10 years, via a new fee on VA loans.

MOAA President and CEO Lt. Gen. Dana T. Atkins, (USAF, Ret.) says, "This is a very disappointing turn of events and frankly, MOAA sees VA's attempt to contest the blue water legislation as breaking trust with not only the



veterans dealing with these debilitating conditions, but likely to further erode the faith and confidence veterans in general have with VA as an institution, at a critical time when VA is struggling to rebuild its image among veterans they serve...MOAA intends to work with our veteran and military service organization partners, along with the VA, to find an equitable solution for those veterans impacted by their service during the Vietnam era."

HR 229 passed the U.S. House on 25 June 2018, now in the U.S. Senate for consideration, text of which can be viewed at: https://www.govtrack.us/congress/bills/115/hr299/text.

In closing, our chapter remains proud and in great support of both of our legislative awardees for 2018. As we enter the final months of this year and the start of 2019, we will remain vigilant regarding the legislative issues at hand, to include H.R. 299.

SURVIVING SPOUSE CORNER: TREATING HEARING LOSS ENHANCES QUALITY OF LIFE

Ranking behind only heart disease and arthritis, hearing loss is the third largest public health issue in America. According to the National Center for Health Statistics, 48 million Americans (20 percent of the population) have some degree of hearing loss. Left untreated, it has been shown to impact overall health and quality of life, sometimes leading to social isolation, depression, & dementia.

Among the causes are aging, chronic exposure to loud noises, damage to the inner ear, heredity, and infections. Some medications and illnesses also can cause hearing loss. Available treatments include hearing aids, cochlear implants, and assistive listening devices. To determine the most appropriate treatment, it's best to be checked by a hearing professional.

Hearing loss that occurs gradually with aging is common. About 25 percent of people in the U.S. between the ages of 55 and 64 have some hearing loss. Roughly half of Americans over 65 experience some hearing loss. A major study published in the July 17, 2018, issue of The Lancet identified "midlife hearing loss" as the highest total changeable risk factor for dementia. According to JAMA Internal Medicine, cognitive decline occurs more quickly among adults with hearing loss compared to those without. Several studies have confirmed hearing loss was significantly associated with an increased risk of depression in adults of all ages.

At least 10 million Americans may experience hearing problems caused by loud noises. Many military veterans, construction workers, farmers, musicians, airport workers, and landscape workers have hearing problems even in their younger and middle years because of exposure to loud noise. Young people ages 12 to 35 around the world are at risk of hearing loss due to noise exposure in recreational settings.

Treatment depends on factors causing the hearing loss as well as the needs of the individual. Most hearing aids to-day provide better sound quality and speech understanding than recent models. Hearing aids can be worn in or behind the ear and can be adjusted through a smartphone. Cochlear implants are small electronic devices surgically implanted in the inner ear that provide a sense of sound to people who are profoundly deaf or hard-of-hearing. Assistive listening devices include telephone and cellphone amplifying devices, smartphone or tablet apps, and closed-circuit systems in places of worship, theaters, and auditoriums.

Better hearing can dramatically improve quality of life, provide more self-confidence and closer relationships, lessen of depression, and improve outlook on the future.
