Mayor's Commission on Veterans Affairs (MCVA) Veterans Day Ceremony 2018 CDR Linc Smith, USNR (Ret)

The City of Chesapeake held the annual Veterans Day Ceremony on 11 November, honoring the 100th anniversary of Remembrance Day, now known Veterans Day. Mayor's Commission Chair LSCM Julie Chandoo, USN (Ret) introduced Major General John P. McLaren, USA (Ret), keynote speaker for the ceremony. During his remarks, MG McLaren emphasized the need for service above self with the young people of our nation.



Joint Leadership Council of Veterans Service Organizations

The mission of the Joint Leadership Council is to provide advice and assistance to the Governor, General Assembly and the Department of Veterans Services (DVS) on matters of concern to the veterans community and provides a conduit of information to and from the veterans service organizations on policy and legislation, pending and enacted, as well as information on existing services. Please see the below chart for a summary of 2019 JLC Policy Initiatives.

Initiative	Recommendation
JLC 2019-01 Increased State Active Duty (SAD) Pay	That the Governor and General Assembly appropriate \$50,000 to ensure that all Virginia National Guardsmen are paid at least at the E6 rate.
JLC 2019-02 Income Tax Subtraction for Certain Low- Income 100% Disabled Veterans	That the Governor and General Assembly approve an individual income tax subtraction for 100% service-connected disabled veterans with a federally adjusted gross income, not exceeding 150% of the federal poverty level for a four-person household, who have not already claimed another exemption.
JLC 2019-03 <i>Electronic Ballot Return</i>	That the Governor and General Assembly enact legislation and provide budget support of a pilot program at the Virginia State Board of Elections for \$100,000 and funding for one FTE, for a limited pilot program for the electronic return of absentee ballots by Virginia's deployed military service members.
JLC 2019-04 <i>Personal Property Tax Relief for Certain</i> <i>Disabled Veterans</i>	That the Governor and General Assembly approve legislation creating a standardized, statewide personal property tax exemption for one vehicle for 100% service-connected, total and permanent disabled veterans.
JLC 2019-05 <i>Free Tuition for Virginia National Guards-</i> <i>men</i>	That the Governor and General Assembly provide budget support of approximately a \$1 mil- lion increase in the annual State Tuition Assistance program for a pilot program to cover the estimated 3.5% of Guardsmen seeking a degree who are not currently completely covered by federal and state tuition assistance.
JLC 2019-06 <i>VMSDEP</i>	That the Governor and General Assembly remove the requirement that a veteran's disability rating be combat related. Instead, a permanent service-connected disability rating of at least 90%, plus satisfaction of the other requirements currently in the Code, would qualify a veteran's spouse or child for VMSDEP benefits.
JLC 2019-07 <i>Phased-in_System for Partial State Tax</i> <i>Exemption for Military Retirement Income</i>	That the Governor and General Assembly support changes to the current Virginia tax laws for a phased in system to reduce state tax on military retirement income up to \$40,000, for retirees 65 years of age or older.

This voluntary program is designed to Chapter members and help their dependent's to renew their ID cards in a timely fashion. Once you and your dependents are enrolled, you will be notified of your impending ID card expiration date in sufficient time for renewal prior to the expiration date.

To enroll by mail: make copies of the form below for each dependent and fill out the required information. Mail to Military ID Card Notification Program, HRCMOAA, PO Box 4612, Virginia Beach, VA 23454-0612.

Note: Over age 75 members, who are eligible uniform family members and survivors of deceased personnel are now eligible for Permanent Identification Cards. Apply within 90 days of expiration of current ID card.

Honor Flight Mission #20 - "The Final Mission"


For the past 10 years, a Zero Dark Thirty muster occurred on two Saturdays annually. One in the Fall and the other during the Spring. Countless numbers of active duty, students, volunteers, family members and friends have come out to pay collective respects and render honors to WWII, Korean War and recently Vietnam War Veterans as they loaded up in waiting buses to take them to Washington DC to visit War Memorials built in their honor. This past muster that took place Saturday October 20, 2018



was the FINAL MISSION #20 under the title "Honor Flight Historic Triangle (Williamsburg, Virginia). For ten years, Old Dominion University NROTC Hampton Roads, Old Dominion University AROTC Monarch Battalion, Princess Anne and Landstown High Schools respective Navy/Army ROTC and NJROTC students were there supporting our veterans. Other civic organizations were also present during these events. Board of Director members from the Hampton Roads Chapter Military Officers Association of America, Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) members and VFW Riders were also present providing much needed support. Old Dominion University's (ODU) Army ROTC Monarch Battalion usually provided an Officer-In-Charge (OIC) and a Non-Commissioned Officer-In-Charge (NCOIC) ensuring the placement of personnel and adhering to the itinerary to make the Southside Departure Ceremony run smoothly and efficiently so that buses were loaded and departed on schedule.

As many of you know Honor Flight is a national organization that takes WW II, KOREAN WAR VETS and now welcoming VIETNAM veterans to Washington, DC to visit their WAR ME-MORIALS built in their honor. Honor Flight Historic Triangle Virginia (HFHTVA) is a Williamsburg-based non-profit organization established in October 2008 with one goal: To take every World War II, Korean War and terminally ill veteran in the Hampton Roads and Richmond areas that is able and has not visited the World War II Memorial built in their honor on a charter bus day trip to Washington, DC. There is no charge to the veterans as they paid for it through their dedicated service to our great nation more than sixty five years ago. HFHTVA is a hub of the National Honor Flight Network, which was founded in 2005 and has over 130 hubs throughout the United States. They have taken over 160,000 veterans to the memorial as of November 2014.

PLEASE NOTE: Honor Flight made their final two trips this year, missions 19 and 20 in the spring and fall of 2018. Participation of our WWII and Korean War Veterans on these missions to Washington D.C. has been trending down over the past few years. Additionally, the HFHTVA Board feels that by Mission 20 they will have successfully achieved their original mission to escort all local WWII Veterans willing and able to our Nation's Capital to visit the National WWII Memorial. During this Final Mission 41 veterans, 9 of which were WWII veterans departed, from the Southside. There is planning to continue these Missions but under another name. This decision to do so is expected sometime in January 2019 as donors are being considered to continue with these events. Thank you to Honor Flight participants for all of the assistance you provided in support of these missions it was greatly appreciated!

A member of the Surviving Spouse Advisory Committee shares memories from her favorite military assignment.

An overseas assignment can be a wonderful experience. One of our favorite locations was a small base in England. My husband's role was installation commander and commander of an engineering unit that could deploy and establish a site complete with landing strip. This took place from 1986-89.

I was not planning to work during this assignment. However, the principal of the school system at our new base learned I had the certification and teaching experience that was needed, and I was offered a job. For the next three years, I taught six classes every day with one planning period.

Because the base had more enlisted personnel than officers, we had a consolidated spouses' club, which held monthly meetings with a variety of guest speakers. The wife of one of the mayors of a neighboring city owned a women's clothing store, so with her support, the spouses' club presented three fashion shows that were open to the public.

The Anglo American club was another highlight. A retired British business man (with a military background) and my spouse cochaired the club. The chairman and his wife invited base residents to a Sunday afternoon garden party at their home. Another special event was the George Washington Ball held annually in February. The first year, we encouraged our first sergeant and his wife to rent costumes and attend as George and Martha Washington. Our British and American guests loved it.

Our chaplain arranged for bus trips to events in London. My husband's favorite was a Roger Whittaker concert. A very memorable occasion for me was "finding" the locations of John Constable paintings.

When the spouses' club honored me with a farewell tea, we met at the Tea Cottage in our neighboring village. The staff served freshly baked scones, strawberry preserves with clotted cream, and tea. Our three years passed quickly and it was difficult to say good-bye to our friends on base and in the community.




