As we celebrate the Holiday Season 2021, a centerpiece to the deliberations of the 117th United States Congress session is the National Defense Authorization Act 2022 (NDAA 2022). With this, the focus of our Holiday 2021 Legislative Affairs Update is three fold. First, brief spotlight on NDAA 2022. Second, highlight of four MOAA priorities in the NDAA House version, hopefully to carry over into the Senate version. Finally, a request to take action. As of this article writing, NDAA 2022 is unsigned.

NDAA Basics and Status

In short, the NDAA authorizes appropriations for Department of Defense military activities and programs, such as personnel, research, development and test and evaluation. In turn, the NDAA authorizes aircraft, missiles, and ammunition. The NDAA also prescribes military personnel end strengths.

NDAA passage is no exception to the otherwise complex legislative process of bill introduction. Legislative stages include passage in the senate and the house, signature by the president, then becoming law. Keep in mind that the effort to complete the NDAA before 1 October has remained. By the Constitution, the House and Senate versions of the bill must be in the same form prior to presidential presentation.

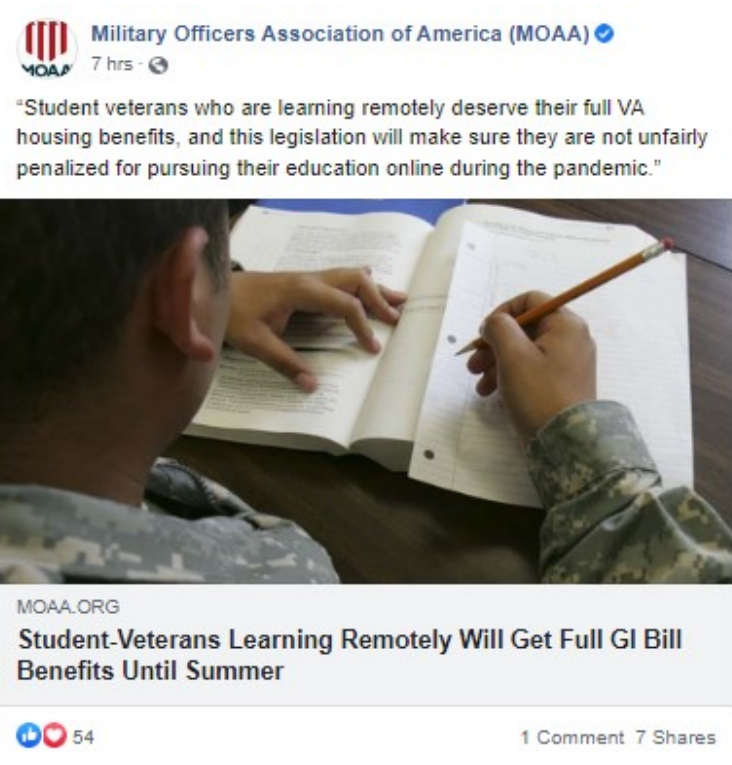

The NDAA is a “must-pass” bill, having been approved by Congress each year, for 60 years. NDAA does not appropriate funding for defense, rather, it authorizes appropriations for spending.

To the aforementioned basics, the Senate Armed Services Committee reported the NDAA this year to the Senate on September 22, with the House passing their version (H.R. 4350) on the following day. In early November, Senator Chuck Schumer (D NY) was called upon to bring the NDAA (S. 2792) to the Senate floor for vote. Both the House and Senate versions will require reconciliation in conference. Differences will result in a reworked bill, then forwarded to the Senate and House for final vote. This process of compromise and final agreement can take weeks. With a final vote, the NDAA will be sent to the President to be signed into law, date to be determined.

MOAA Priorities

The House passed version of NDAA 2022 (H.R. 4350) includes several MOAA supported provisions which could carry over into the Senate version (S. 2792). The provisions include: TRICARE Young Adult Coverage Gap, Assisting Military Survivors, Concurrent Receipt and Reversing Planned Eligibility Changes at Arlington National Cemetery. A primary goal is for each of the aforementioned MOAA priorities to be a part of the final bill from the joint conference committee.

This voluntary program is designed to help Chapter members and their dependent's to renew their ID cards in a timely fashion. Once you and your dependents are enrolled, you will be notified of your impending ID card expiration date in sufficient time for renewal prior to the expiration date.

To enroll by mail: make copies of the form below for each dependent and fill out the required information. Mail to Military ID Card Notification Program, HRCMOAA, PO Box 4612, Virginia Beach, VA 23454-0612.

To enroll by email: visit our website, www.hrcmoaa.org and click on About Our Chapter and the ID Card Notification Program link and follow the instructions.

Note: Over age 75 members, who are eligible uniform family members and survivors of deceased personnel are now eligible for Permanent Identification Cards. Apply within 90 days of expiration of current ID card.

Are You Eligible?

U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs

You may be eligible for newly enacted service-connected benefits. Over the course of the last six months, the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has begun processing service-connected disability claims for six new presumptive conditions related to environmental exposures during military service. We request your help in making more Veterans aware of these newly added presumptive conditions to help them file a claim and obtain any earned benefits.

In May 2021, VA started implementing provisions of the William M. Thornberry National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2021 (NDAA), adding bladder cancer, hypothyroidism and Parkinsonism to the list of medical conditions presumptively associated with exposure to Agent Orange. A few months later VA added asthma, rhinitis and sinusitis (to include rhinosinusitis) on a presumptive basis based on particulate matter exposures during military service in Southwest Asia and certain other areas.

Any Veteran who was previously denied service-connection for any of these six conditions but had symptoms manifest within 10 years of military service would need to file a supplemental claim. Be sure to use [VA Form 20-0995, Decision Review Request: Supplemental Claim](#) when filing. The claim form should include the name of the condition and specify that the condition is being claimed due to in-service exposure to environmental hazards. VA is committed to assisting Veterans who may have been exposed to hazardous materials during their military service.

Be sure to stay plugged in to www.va.gov for the most recent developments around environmental exposures during military service, as VA is constantly conducting research and surveillance as well as reviewing scientific literature for conditions that may be related to exposure during military service. This past year, several of your HRCMOAA board members met with Ms. Andrea Rand, the director of the MOAA Scholarship program to request some changes to how scholarships in our chapter name were being awarded. As a result of our suggestions and input, the MOAA Scholarship Fund Board has agreed to make several important changes. The MOAA Scholarship Fund Board now gives preference in awarding scholarships and grants to children with HRCMOAA chapter member parents. 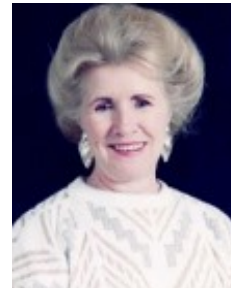
