SURVIVING SPOUSE CORNER: A MONTH OF REMEMBERANCE

May is a month with many special events and memories. For some, it means graduations or wedding showers. For gardeners, seedlings are fulfilling their promise; perennials are blooming; and the scent of lilacs and peonies enter the home as windows are finally opened. For children, it's the promise of lazy summer days or the opening of the community pool. For schools, it's the month of awards and scholarships. For the family, it's the appreciation of mothers. My May memories are of Mother's Day and Memorial Day traditions.

When I was young, we had a lovely tradition of women and girls wearing corsages and men wearing boutonnieres to church on Mother's Day. In my family, we made our own. If you wore white flowers that meant your mother was dead. Colored flowers signified your mother was living. Nearly everyone wore flowers on Mother's Day.

After church, we changed into our work clothes and went to the graveyards. We cleared away dead leaves and weeds, overturned the earth in front of the headstones, and planted flowers and watered them so they would be blooming when we came to visit the gravesites on Memorial Day.

Memorial Day usually meant a parade through town. Afterward, there was often a picnic. We always visited the graves of our loved ones and shared memories of them. Flags were placed at the gravestone of each veteran.

Today, still, there are many commemorative ceremonies. I usually go to the national cemetery where my husband and many of our friends are buried. The American flags are beautiful, lining every street and positioned at each headstone. The music is inspiring, and the speaker's message is notable.

May is a month for remembering those we've lost. There is an atmosphere of sadness, patriotism, and pride. I've known sorrow, we all have, but I can't imagine the grief of a Gold Star Mother in May. Remember her in your prayers on Mother's Day and hold her in your heart on Memorial Day.

2022 SPRING JOINT ARMY / NAVY ROTC COMMISSION CEREMONY

After two years of virtual commission ceremonies where in-person participation was strictly limited to immediate family and mandatory mask mandates were in place Old Dominion University held its "first back to normal" Joint Army / Navy Joint Commission Ceremony in front of a large gathering of family, friends and colleagues. The Chartway Arena of Old Dominion University's (ODU) Ted Constant Convocation Center was the site for the annual Spring US ARMY and US NAVAL SERVICE ROTC Commission Ceremony held on Thursday, 5 May 2022. The US Army's ODU Monarch Battalion, commanded by Lieutenant Colonel (LTC) Camala L. Coats, USA commissioned 12 Second Lieutenants in the US Army, Army National Guard and Army Reserves. The Hampton Roads NROTC Unit, commanded by Captain (CAPT) Michael "Dan-O" Bratley, USN is a consortium comprised of four universities and a community college; Old Dominion University, Norfolk State University, Regent University, Hampton University and Tidewater Community College. The Naval Service ROTC Unit commissioned 19 Ensigns in the Navy and 1 Second Lieutenant in the United States Marine Corps. A total of 32 students were developed morally, mentally, physically and were imbued with the highest ideals of duty, honor, and loyalty in order to commission college graduates as military officers. These newly commissioned officers possess a basic professional background, are motivated toward careers in the military, and have a potential for future development in mind and character so as to assume the highest responsibilities of command, citizenship and government. Opening remarks were provided by LTC Coats, USA, Dr. Brian O. Hemphill, the ninth president of Old Dominion University and CAPT Bratley, USN. The commission ceremony was honored to have, as its guest speaker, Vice Admiral (VADM) James Kilby, USN, Deputy Commander U.S. Fleet Forces Command who provided keynote remarks and issued the Oath of Office.

VADM Kilby is a native of Pound Ridge, New York and graduated from the United States Naval Academy in 1986. VADM Kilby commanded several surface warfare combatants where he received the Vice Admiral James B. Stockdale Award for inspirational leadership. He also served as commander, Carl Vinson Strike Group, and deployed to the Western Pacific in 2017. He assumed his role as Deputy Commander U.S. Fleet Forces in August 2021.



MOAA Hampton Roads Chapter past president Colonel Jim Edge, USA (Ret) and Board of Director Captain Mike "Breeze" Barea, USN (Ret), attended the ceremony presenting GOLD BARS to newly Commissioned Officers following respective congratulations from the Official Party on stage. To enroll by email: visit our website, www.hrcmoaa.org and click on About Our Chapter and the ID Card Notification Program link and follow the instructions.

Note: Over age 75 members, who are eligible uniform family members and survivors of deceased personnel are now eligible for Permanent Identification Cards. Apply within 90 days of expiration of current ID card.

VIRGINIA BEACH VETERANS DAY EVENT

The Hampton Roads Council of Veterans Organizations (HRCVO) will host the annual Tidewater Veterans Day Parade in Virginia Beach on Friday, 11 November 2022. The parade will begin at 9:00 AM. The parade route this year has changed and will start from the Virginia Beach Oceanfront on Atlantic Avenue and proceed up 17th Street, right turn onto Mediterranean Avenue, then a left turn onto 19th Street pass the Tidewater Veterans Memorial (across from the Virginia Beach Convention Center) ending at the DoubleTree Hotel.

For over thirty years, the HRCVO has been coordinating the Veterans Day Parade and associated events. Each year, one of the HRCVO member organizations co-sponsors the parade. This year the Sons of Confederate Veterans is the co-sponsor organization. In addition to the parade, a short ceremony is held at the Tidewater Veterans Memorial immediately following the parade and a luncheon honoring our Veterans is held at the DoubleTree Hotel at approximately 12:00 PM.

The Veterans Day Parade is sanctioned by the Department of Veterans Affairs National Veterans Day Committee and the Mayors of Chesapeake, Norfolk, Portsmouth, Suffolk and Virginia Beach who sign a proclamation resolving that "citizens, businesses and organizations demonstrate due appreciation, admiration and respect for all veterans who have served our great nation".

As usual, following the parade, there will be a ceremony at the Tidewater Veterans Memorial and a Luncheon at the DoubleTree Hotel.

The Hampton Roads Chapter of MOAA has been invited to participate in the parade and the luncheon. We must submit our application for parade participation no later than 1 October 2022 to the HRCVO Parade Coordinator.

The Hampton Roads Chapter of MOAA has also been invited to attend the Veterans Day Luncheon at approximately 1200 (or immediately following the Memorial Ceremony at the completion of the parade). The luncheon will be held at the Double Tree Hotel, 1900 Pavilion Drive, Virginia Beach, Virginia and the price is \$25.00 per person. Tickets are sold in advance and must be presented at the door. If a number of people from the chapter want to attend and sit together, we can coordinate as a group and purchase a group of tickets. Otherwise, RSVP separately by 30 October to 757-663-1495 and make your check payable to Hampton Roads Council of Veterans Organizations.
