Governor Kaine Exonerates the Witch of Pungo!

On July 10th, 2006 at 10:00 am, exactly 300 years from the date and time of the original water trial in 1706, Ferry Plantation House hosted a reenactment of the trial of Grace Sherwood, (a.k.a. the Witch of Pungo). The ceremony also celebrated the official pardon recently granted by Governor Timothy Kaine, exonerating Grace Sherwood. Mayor Meyera Oberndorf was on hand during the festivities, declaring July 10th "Grace Sherwood Day". Grace Sherwood was the only woman tried by water in Virginia. She was tried and jailed in a brick building which used to be adjacent to where the Old Donation Church stands today.

Congratulations to Belinda Nash, who has been working for years researching the history of Grace Sherwood, and fighting to get Grace's name cleared. Many thanks to Belinda Nash and Gerry Richter for their tireless efforts at Ferry Plantation House. We also wish to thank all our neighbors and esteemed guests who participated in making this such a memorable event.

Summer Campers LIVE THE LIFE of Ferry Plantation House

This summer's Ferry Plantation House Camps provided the chance for children to experience life as it was in the 1700's and 1800's. Children participated in daily chores including caring for the gardens and collecting eggs. They made and ate foods authentic to the time period, including beef jerky, apple leather, hardtack, and hand-churned butter. Many Feathers was on hand teaching the children authentic crafts and traditions of local Native American heritage. Children dug in the archaelogical site, finding artifacts from the Walke Manor house that burned in the 1700's. Advanced camp participants were trained and inducted as Civil War soldiers (with this event being shown on PBS Television in October). Camp finished off with an authentic tea party, complete with period costumes and china settings, and the last day featured the children in a play reenacting the trial of Grace Sherwood– BRAVO!

18th Annual Clean the Bay Day-Another Successful Event!

On June 10th, our community of Pembroke Meadows, Pembroke Shores and Old Donation Farms was once again commended for our significant participation in the 18th Annual Clean the Bay Day. Concentrating on cleaning the lakes and adjacent waterways in our neighborhood, 73 volunteers participated and picked up approximately 14,000 pounds of trash and debris. Most of the large weight resulted from very large wood debris, including removal of destroyed pier pieces from the Old Donation Creek and River areas.

Come out of the dark and switch to fluorescent lights. They are 3 to 4 times more efficient than incandescents and last 10 times as long. Replacing an incandescent bulb with a compact fluo-

rescent will save the energy equivalent of 46 gallons of oil, as well as one-half ton of carbon dioxide emissions over the lifetime of the bulb.
