



Many a neighbor learned to swim at the pool and many honed their skills on the Marlins Swim Team. Check out the PMCL website for more information about pool and/or swim team membership.



### MY OPINION: A DISCOURAGING TURNOUT

At 8:15 Saturday morning, there were exactly 6 adult volunteers at the pool for Spring Fling, myself and 5 of the Pool Board members. As the morning progressed, a few kids and perhaps another half dozen adults came and went that actually did some work. If the lifeguards had not shown up at 10 AM, we would not have even had enough to pull off the pool cover! We ended up paying the guards to stay and help with the clean up. I know of only one other person who worked on the area at the dam. This is just so discouraging to the people who do volunteer their time, a dozen people cannot do everything that needs to be done at the pool, not to mention the park, the dam and the median. If we have to start paying the guards to do the work that used to be done by volunteers, I will not vote to continue the stimulus plan that the civic league provides to lower the cost of pool memberships and just recommend we give that money to the pool to pay for more guard time. Perhaps the pool membership should include either mandatory volunteer time or paying an additional fee. I hate to see it come to this, but come on, people! If you can't make it on Spring Fling Day or closing day, then contact a board member and come up to the pool another day, there is often a board member there working.


