Carol Moore gave the Treasurer's Report. Our current overall total is \$11,903.76. We have \$4,873.74 in Civic League Checking and \$12,130.02 in the Business Money Market account, for total assets of \$17,003.76. There are liabilities of \$5,100.00, resulting in the net total above--\$11,903.76.

Mike Moore said the pool will be open on Saturday and Sunday at 11 o'clock. The cover will be pulled at 2:00 on Sunday, and lots of people are needed to help with that.

The Halloween Walk will be next month. We need volunteers and donations! The Walk will be on the 26<sup>th</sup> at 3:00 in the afternoon. This will be the 23rd year for this event.

Kate Nixon noted that children in the Shores who attend Pembroke Meadows Elementary School are no longer being picked up by a bus—they're now walking. Look out for them.
