Charter Members Sought

Bids Taken, July 4 'Splash' Eyed At Meadows Recreation Center

"total recreation center" at Pembroke Meadows is no longer just a dream.

The Pembroke Meadows Civic League now is making plans for a "splash party" July 4 in the first phase of the reality - an "L" shaped 80-by-40-foot

Bids on construction of the pool and adjoining bath houses were to have been opened April 2. And, hopefully, actual work on the initial project would be started within a few days.

The master plan for the Meadows Recreation Center was given enthusiastic approval at the civic league's March meeting and a stock-membership drive was launched immediately.

C.C. Taylor, civic league president, now reports that about 180 Pembroke Meadows homeowners have been contacted as prospective Rec Center stockholders and more than 80 per cent of them have indicated they will participate.

The thinking now is that the charter stock-memberships will be limited to 200 families. However, Taylor emphasized that the cutoff date and number of charter stockholders to be accepted will be determined at the civic league's April 8 meeting.

During the current drive, a family may become a part owner of the total recreation facility for \$200 - and the civic league has made arrangements for financing through local banks.

Shares will be higher, probably by \$50, after the initial drive ends.

The Rec Center program will be set up for membership stock to be transferred (sold) if a family should move from Pembroke Meadows. And, besides providing a family with privileges of all facilities in the center, there's (Continued on Page 2)

Plans are all set - complete with \$150 in prize money - for the first annual Pembroke Meadows Green Thumb



Terry Homeowners Offered Pembroke Shores Preview

Pembroke Shores, a new neighborhood of 118 fully developed homesites off the Lynnhaven River, will be offered to the public this summer — but families now living in Terry-built homes are being given advance opportunities in the highly-desirable neighborhood.
