Where The Fun Is Happening! Aragona Recreational Center

Funds amounted to only \$48.61 ten years ago when Aragona Recreation Center was formed in 1958 and the Civic League president appointed five members to look into the possibility of recreational facilities for the area. It has been a long, hard struggle from scratch with many problems and projects to face. With an active Civic League the community raised money for every street light in Aragona Village by collecting donations door-todoor. Each street light cost the residents \$18.50. "We fought for things that people now receive and take for granted in the other areas," says Robert Harvey. Harvey is the only one of the original Recreation Committee still active. The Recreation Center "has grown beyond my fondest dreams. This was done by a small segment of people and it still is," Harvey said.

The building was opened in 1961 and now it can accomodate as many as 600 people for a banquet. The present net worth of the building and grounds is \$75,000 and the total for the equipment is \$25,000. And all from \$48.61!

Board members of the Rec Center include Elmer Sahr, Chairman; Sidney Wilhelm, Vice Chairman; Isaac Snyder, Treasurer; C. T. Dunnington, President; Mrs. Donna Harvey, Recording Secretary; Robert Harvey, Mrs. Rita Benner and John Harvey.

The center is used for functions including six scheduled pre-teen and teen dances every month and "Adult Social Nites" every Tuesday and Friday.

At Christmas the adult members assisted 50 underprivileged families with food and Santa arrived with bags of candy for the children after he had heard their wishes. The Center also gave the Volunteer Fire Department a mobile canteen so hot coffee and food could be taken to firemen at emergency scenes.


The Rec Center recently purchased two more lots ajoining their property and the parking lot has been marked off for cars with bright yellow lines. A baseball field for the Aragona-Pembroke Little League will be put to greater use this spring and summer with another field being readied right next to the present one.

Harvey, Assistant Manager and a Director of the Rec Center, is busy working on new floors and a new office upstairs. His greatest asset and biggest helper is 8-year old little Mike Matthews who has been helping Harvey for four years. "I help put up chairs, clean tables and wash booths," Mike said modestly. And that's a lot of hard work and well done, stated Harvey.

About 1,500 people make up the five types of membership in the center. There are "Pre-Teens," "Teens," "Social," "Regular," and "Associate" memberships. "Social" members are invited to the functions but have no voice or voting privileges."Associate" members are those who live outside the area.

One Saturday each month a "covered dish" supper is held for the adults. Last month a crowd of 463 teens turned out to rock to the mighty sounds of 'The Aliens.'

Picnics are on schedule for members during the sunny days ahead besides

baseball, dances and suppers. Persons interested in membership may contact Robert Harvey at the Aragona Recreation Center.

An open adult dance will be held at 9 p.m. - until. Tickets may be purchased at the Rec Center for \$2.00 per person. Tickets will include set-ups and ice. May 17 is the date.

Summer Activities Underway Meadows

A cool, sunny Saturday morning brought out the shovels that turned the ground to make the first hole that began final steps towards construction on the Pembroke Meadows Recreation Center's new 82' x 35' pool.

The plans were advertised publicly and the contract has been awarded to Schertle Pools of Newport News.

C.C. Taylor, civic league president, was Master of Ceremonies for the crowd of almost 40 people. Jim Donahue spoke on behalf of Howard Harris, chairman of the "Ways and Means" Committee who was unable to attend.

The Building Committee was represented by Don Dreelin who also spoke to the group.

Bayside Borough Councilman, Larry Marshall, told the group how pleased he was to see this league going ahead with plans. A positive group, as this league is, enhances the community; complimenting the City's efforts. He was happy to see that the people of the Meadows could do things on their

Marshall mentioned that the area was at first opposed to Pembroke Meadows. but that it had become a delightful part of the community.

Fred Pearson is heading up the pool committee and is presently working on by-laws, rules, and regulations by which the pool will be governed, subject to the approval of the league.

The pool, shower and pool equipment buildings will be finished between June 15 and July 4.

The money drive has produced almost \$20,000 with the membership still open. The price for the bonds will be raised then the Ways and Means committe has reached the necessary amount or when the pool opens.

The Civic League has already increased by 25 new members.

At a recent meeting with the Board of Directors Civic League, Horace Cistola and Fred Napolitano, principals of Terry Corp., reported to the group the total conception of development for the area, including townhouses, apartments and shopping areas. photographs the suspect, then an arrest card is made out and the suspect is put into the "bull pen" if he can't bail out.

Roll call for on-duty officers is held three times during a 24 hour period in the Assembly Room. The officers give offense reports which average a minimum of eight per man each shift. After there has been several repeated incidents in an area, special surveilance is added. FBI flyers on wanted criminals are added to the crowded bulletin board.

The Shore Patrol, headed by Chief F. A. Holloway, Detachment Commander, Va. Beach, operates around-the-clock and a Justice of the Peace also has an office at the precinct.

The day shift is the shortest shift, man-power wise. Less men are needed during the daylight hours. Their jobs also entail the service, maintenance and transportation of all vehicles.

Disturbances, domestic quarrels, drunks and fights are the greatest problems for the evening shifts. Also security checks of buildings are made after closing hours. The greatest amount of calls are taken during the evening.

"The main reasons range from barking dogs to murders, but domestic quarrels number the most. Anything the average citizen doesn't know how to handle we get a call about. We try to soothe or advise them when they call," says Sgt. L. G. Sutton.

On top of those minimum of eights calls per shift that require a report, the average officer serves warrants, assists in traffic tie-ups and accidents, and makes house and building checks.

After hours, supervisory officers

(sergeants, lieutenants, and captains) teach classes in certain phases of police work. These are often taught at the Tidewater Police Academy at Old Dominion College in Norfolk.

Lectures on drugs and narcotics are presented to area high schools.

A good police officer is probably more human than any professional, for they are doctors, lawyers, ministers, fathers and disciplinarians all rolled into one man. And their contacts are mostly under adverse conditions.
