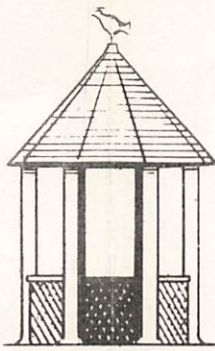

April & May Civic League Meeting:

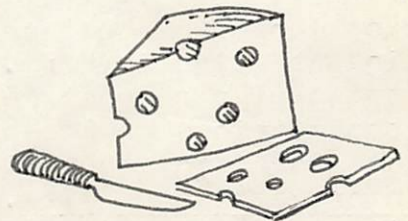

Cheese Nibblers:

1 C. flour
1 C. shredded American or Sharp Cheddar cheese.
 $\frac{1}{2}$ C. soft butter
 $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. salt
Combine all ingredients. Blend with a pastry blender. Knead in bowl to form dough. Shape into balls, using 1 scant tsp. each. Place on ungreased bake sheets. Bake at 350 for 12-15 min. Makes about 5 doz. (Dough can be made ahead and kept in the ref. until ready to bake.)

Cable T.V.:

Television viewers in the Pembroke area will be the first in the city to be able to subscribe to cable t.v. Cox Franchises will begin constrctn. by Jan. 11, 1977, and Beach residents will be able to hook up by Jan. 1978. The connection fee will be \$20.00 and there will be a monthly service rate of \$7.50, including a one dollar converter fee. The converter fee will
