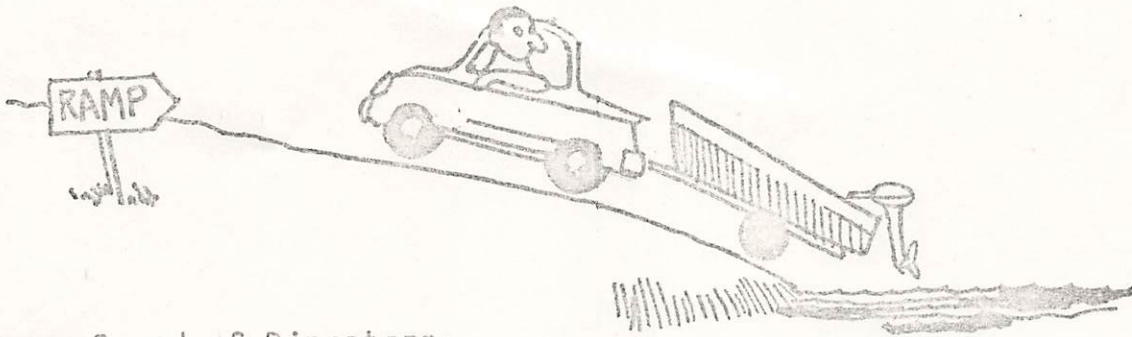

Cherry Torte:

16 graham crackers
1/3 c. melted margerine
1 c. sugar

Cherry Torte con't:

- 1 pkg. cream cheese
- 2 eggs
- 1 can cherry pie filling

Crush graham crackers. Add melted margerine and 1/2 sugar. Press in corn- ing ware 10" pan. Beat cream cheese, remaining sugar and eggs until smooth. Pour over crumbs and bake in oven for 25 min. at 325. After cooling, pour cherry filling over top. Chill for at least 3 hours.

So, please try and help in the cleaning up of the Lynnhaven by using trash cans instead of the drains.

The company pumps the oil up to Richmond.

They put it in a holding tank until a truck comes by to take it to a reprocessing plant to be recycled.
Murphys Mart service center-Witchduck and Independence.
They store the oil underground.

Flower Classes:

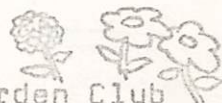
