SEWAGE RATE INCREASE

Each of the independent sewage utilities have applied for rate increases of more than 100%. These are Pembroke Utilities, Inc., Aragona Utilities Corp. and Princess Anne Utilities Corp. All three are soon to be purchased by the City of Virginia Beach as part of their overall sewage system upgrading program. These independent utilities transport your sewage to the main Hampton Roads Sanitation District lines for which service you have been paying \$9.00 per quarter. The proposed new rate for residential customers will increase this fee to \$19.50 per quarter.

Public hearings will be held at 2:00 p.m., ovember 21, 1977 in the State Corporation Commission Court Room, Blanton Building, Bank and Governor Streets, Richmond, Va. Any interested person who desires to make a

statement at the hearing on his own behalf either for or against the rate increase may appear at the hearing before 1:45 p.m. on November 21st and fill out a Notice of Appearance Form. All persons will be heard beginning at 2:00 p.m.


Costume Contest: The costume contest will be held for children of the following age groups. Categories will be Prettiest, Funniest and Ugliest in each age group:
