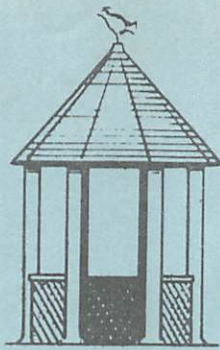

RECREATION CENTER BOAT RAMP:

Jim Willenbrink and Jack Enoch constructed and installed a boat launch facility at the Recreation Center in August. Boat launching into the Lynnhaven River is accomplished by hoisting small boats onto the ways of the ramp and sliding the boat and ways via installed rollers over the marsh grass into the water. The launch has a limited weight capacity and only boats of 14 feet or less can be accommodated. (Those which can be lifted by two people generally). Regrettably, tides limit the use of the launch facility since the river has not as yet been dredged.

To prevent damage/loss of the ramp, a chain and lock have been installed. Keys for the lock can be procured from Jack Enoch for \$1.50 per key and will permit use of the ramp through 1 January 1980.

BLOCK SECURITY PROGRAM:

Block Security, a program designed by the Virginia Beach Crime Prevention Committee, is aimed at halting neighborhood crime.

Neighbors can halt crime by looking out of their windows and keeping an eye on nearby houses:

## PROSPECTIVE SALE OF CREASY REALTY BUILDING TO AGAPE BAPTIST CHURCH:

A special session of the Civic League was convened on 29 May 1978 to address the prospective sale of the Creasy Realty Building to Agape Baptist Church. Members present voiced objections to the use of the property for church functions primarily due to the problems associated with increased automobile traffic and parking. A vote of those Civic League members present was taken with an overwhelming majority supporting the position that the Civic League submit a letter to Frank Creasy, and to the senior church official, indicating non-support of the Civic League for such a sale and use of the property. The property was ultimately refurbished and is now employed by another realtor.

## FLEA MARKET:

Plans are underway to conduct the semi-annual Flea Market Sale with an alternate date of 1 October 1978 or 8 October 1978 in the parking lot adjacent to the veterinarian clinic in the Pembroke Meadows Shopping Center.
