

RIVER DREDGING

For those who live on the water and for those interested in the boat ramp, the following status is provided.

In 1976, it appeared as though dredging was imminent from the main channel past Oliver's Point to Ed Link's property and the eastern side of the shores to the pool. It never came to pass. The problem which had to be resolved was the designated spoils area. (The place where the dredged material was placed). Resolution of this final phase ran upon "bad ground" when the spoils area previously used on Oliver's property was not available due to the new development and new land owners of the "spoils" property. Negotiations between the Developers and the City of Virginia Beach for the spoils area broke down. A call to the City of Virginia Beach indicates the whole project is in "Limbo". It is appropriate that the Civic League go forward to the City via correspondence and ask that the issue be opened again. It shall be done!

By the way, channel marker number 16 missing in the Lynnhaven River. For those who have made the trip to the Lesner Bridge, you probably guessed and found where the channel wasn't. A call to the City to report the missing marker was made with a report that late in the week of 6-12 May it would be replaced and other markers straightened as well.

THE ANCIENT ART OF SAUNTERING

As physical fitness mania spearheaded by hordes of sweaty joggers seems to be clogging the nation's arteries, a leisurely campaign to revive the almost defunct art of sauntering is gaining momentum - ever so slowly. EARLY MAY 1979

Within a month our pool will be open and we can anticipate many happy days at a facility within the midst of our community. No need to go to the beach, the "Y" or the military facilities. We have it all within walking distance of our homes.

MEMBERSHIP At the time of this printing the paid membership was approximately 130. In accordance with our Rec Center Bylaws those members submitting dues subsequent to April 30th will incur a \$5 late charge. Additionally, in accordance with the Center by laws, each Rec Center member residing within the Meadows/Shores area must be a member of the Civic League. have forgotten to pay their Civic League dues when submitting their pool dues. Please make this \$5 remittance as soon as possible for you will not be issued a pool admittance pass unlesss you are a paid up member of the Civic League. In order to operate a daily eight hour general period plus swimming team and swim lessons each week day morning, 240 members are required. To avoid reducing operating hours it requested you return contract with check or dit card information as soon as possible. The Board of Directors will actively seek new members during the next few weeks. Contact anyone of them for information regarding membership. It is important to submit all the names of the members of your household with your membership for there will be no admittance to the pool deck unless each individual has her pool pass. The Treasurer will be available at the pool from 0900 to 1300, 12 May to receive membership dues.

SWIMMING LESSONS Four levels of swimming instruction will be offered. These lessons will range from the non-swimmer to advanced swimmer instruction. Members fees for these lessons will be:

- 1. \$5 per person
- 2. \$20 Maximum per family

The same instruction will also be offered to non-members at the rate of:

1. \$10 per person

Non-members should note that the facility will be available to them only during the swimming lesson period. Registration will be held at the pool after the pool opens. In order to assure yourself a position in the class, pay your fee at registration. We anticipate classes starting the Monday after school closes unless the requests for adult instruction necessitates an earlier class.

HELP NEEDED Any building or facility that stands idle 3/4 of each year requires an extra amount of maintenance to put it back into operating order. Your swimming pool is no exception. Since the first Saturday in April the Board of Directors has had work sessions each weekend. There are still a myriad of minor tasks which can be done by willing and able members. Each Saturday between 0900-1200 from now until opening day a work session is being held. Take pride and self interest in your investment and help get your facility ready. Contack Dick Koehne (497-2317) or Walt Schriefer (497-3818) for work suggestions and access to the pool at times other than Saturdays. When coming to work sessions on Saturday bring your garden or yard tools such as clippers, garden rakes, pruning shears or saw, flat blade shovel and trash bags.

SWIM TEAM Another exceptional year is anticipated by the swim team. Both members and non-members can participate in this competitive experience. Registration for swimming team fee will be charged each swimmer. Non-members will be charged and additional \$30 each for pool usage during practice sessions.

POOL PARTIES With the season fast approaching you are urged to pick dates for your private parties early and contact the Secretary for date confirmation. The private party charge is \$30 per member and \$50 per non member. The pool areas can more than accommodate 175 people at one time.

voting members meeting on I June at 7:30 P.M. at the pool, rain date 3 June, same time, same location. The February 1979 Newsletter indicated a general meeting would be held early in the season to solicit ideas and report on the Centers financial condition. This is the time to get those innovative ideas off your chest so that they can be utilized during the season. However, don't get carried away with brainstorming unless you are willing to commit your time. The world is full of talkers and complainers but there are very few willing doers.

STAFF The Board of Directors decided and were successful in recruiting a manager from outside the area. In order to maintain a high quality of leadership the qualifications of the manager were set: (1) At least 21 years of age, (2) Current WSI, (3) Current CPR qualified, (4) City certified pool manager, (5) enrolled in or completed a college level water front recreation course.

In order to upgrade our guard staff those individuals which most closely met the above qualifications were selecged to fill the guard positions. Our manager this year will be Mark Dewandle. He will be graduated from William and Mary College this May and meets all the requirements listed above. Additionally, he has managed pools for the past three years. He comes to us with high endorsements as a swimming instructor and team couch. There are three other water safety instructors on our staff who also meet all of the requirements listed for the manager. One of our WSI (Water Safety Instructor) is also qualified to teach CPR. Consequently, the Board of Directors is confident that safety conscious swimming instruction and coaching will be of the highest caliber.

All members must realize that this competent staff's first responsibility is safety at the pool. These employees are in charge whenever the pool is open and they are on duty. If there are any complaints concerning policy or staff contact Dick Voltz or Walt Schriefer.
