Your Civic League Beard has recently received an increasing number of calls concerning the appearance of neighborhood hemes and preperty that appears to be declining in appearance, vehicles that are inoperable or under extensive repair for prolonged periods of time and excessive amounts of trash or disgarded articles. Your Civic League Officers respond to these calls and centact the preperty ewner/renter in an attempt to assist or discuss solutions to correcting the problem and improving the appearance of our community. However, it is quite obvious that so few people cannot observe the entire community and contact or offer assistance to everyone who might require this service.

If you are concerned or aware of someone's property who might require this service, please contact your Civic League Board members, and they will make every effort to contact these persons that might require assistance. Should any resident desire to contact the City of Virginia Beach concerning inoperable vehicles, vehicles undergoing excessive repairs for prolonged periods of time, excessive trash or debris in yards or alongside homes, or homes in states of disrepair with broken windows, fences falling down, excessive weeds or grass, they may call the following agencies for assistance:

Vehicles ----- 427-4211
Trash and Debris ---- 427-4261
Heme Disrepair ----- 427-4421

Inspectors from these agencies will contact the residents of the addresses reported. In the continuing effort by the City of Virginia Beach to maintain our City and preperty values, the City periodically observes neighborhoods for violations of the City Codes as they pertain to homes, yards, vehicles and neighborhoods in general. This program will be conducted by the City of Virginia Beach in our neighborhood during the forthcoming menths. Violators will be centacted by the various agencies for corrective action. Your home is your largest and most valuable asser and is providing you and your family with the

By all residents maintaining their homes and preperty to the very best of their ability, everyone's investment will yield the very highest return while previding you and your family a wenderful home and neighborhood in which to live. PEMBROKE MEADOWS/SHORES RECREATION CENTER NEWS

COME. ON IN THE WATER'S FINE! The last of May brought the culmination of four months of planning. Your pool opened on Memorial weekend. Since that time, weather permitting, the pool has been operating daily. On 31 May a general membership meeting was held. A follow-up general meeting will take place at the pool on 29 June at 7:30 p.m.

MEMBERSHIP! The Rec Center membership is approximately 75 short of its 250 member goal. If the short fall is not significantly reduced by the end of June it will mean that operating hours will be cut. Consider options presented at the May general meeting and be ready to make a decision at the June meeting concerning future operating hours. Better yet if each of our present members would get one additional member the goal would be exceeded. There are ever 600 homes in our neighborhood. That means 400 of our neighbors are not members. Surely, there are at least 75 families who just need to be told about the advantages of belonging to a REC Center within the community. All we need to do is talkto these people and extel our pool. Urge them to contact any committee member or the can join right at the pool.

SWIM TEAM! The team swings into action when practice starts on the 18th of this month. As in past years the competitive season is full of activity. Registrations are being accepted at the pool an any time when the pool is open. The fee is \$5.00 perswimmer for Rec Center members and \$35.00 per swimmer for Non/Rec Center Members.

REC CENTER CONT! SWIM LESSONS! Lessons are underway at present for adults. As soon as summer vacation is here swimming instruction for the children will commence. There are still openings in all classes and registration is being accepted at the pool. Interest is high at all levels of instruction so register early. The fee is \$5.00 per member, \$20.00 maximum per member family and \$10.00 per non-member.

GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING! There were appreximately 100 veting members present at the first meeting. Although the attendance was gratifing it was but 1/3 of our voting membership. Several nevel ideas were suggested to enhance our pool Each new idea will be considered by the Beard. One of our concerned members denoted a ping pong table for which we are grateful. Another gave a menetary gift to the Rec Center over and above his annual dues. With that kind of support we will have a successful season. The pool belongs to its members the Beard merely earries out the desires of the majority of Rec Center members. The following paragraphs, illustrate the desires of the membership in regards to the guest fees.

RECREATION CENTER GUEST FEES! At the request of the Pembrake Meadews/Sheres
Recreation Center General Membership, the Recreation Center Cenmittee has medified
the Guests and Guest Fee regulation to authorize members to extend pool privileges
to bonafide overnight house guests without charge. Please amend your copies of the
Recreation Center Rules and Regulations by replacing the "Guests and Guest Fee"
paragraph on page 5 with the following:

"Overnight Benafide House Guests: Recreation Center Members are authorized to extend usage of the Pembroke Meadows/Shores Recreation Center facilities, without charge, to benafide overnight house guests visiting from outside the Tidewater Area. The Recreation Center Member must give the Pool Manager a letter centaining the guest(s) NAME, PERMANENT HOME ADDRESS and DURATION OF STAY. Upon receipt of the letter, the Pool Manager or Senior Life Guard will issue "GUEST POOL PASSES" to the Recreation Center Member. Guest Pool Passes must be signed for by the Recreation Center Member and returned to the Pool Manager within three days after the guest(s) terminate their visit. Members will be responsible for lost Guest Pool Passes and will be charged a \$1.00 replacement fee for all passes not returned to the Pool Manager.

BONAFIDE DAY HOUSE GUESTS: Guest Fees for benafide Day House Guests of pool members will be \$1.00 per day, per person; except for children under three (3) years of age who will be admitted free. Residents of Pembreke Meadows/Shores who are members of the Recreation Center are not classified as bonafide guests. The benafide day house guest must be accompanied by a Receationt Center Member. Any extended use of this privilege for purposes of avoiding payment of membership fees or other financial consideration shall be prohibited. Any one guest will be restricted to a maximum of fifteen (15) days during the season.

RESIDENTS OF PEMBROKE MEADOWS/SHORES WHO ARE NOT MEMBERS OF THE POOL ARE PROHIBITED FROM USING THE POOL FACILITIES ON A GUEST BASIS: EXCEPT ON TEEN NIGHTS, PRIVATE POOL PARTIES AND SPECIALLY DESIGNATED EVENTS.

TIDEWATER AREA; The Tidewater area is defined as Virginia Beach, Norfolk, Chesapeake, Pertsmouth, Hampton and Newport News."
