The Lighthouse Hotline is the runaway Hotline of Virginia Beach. It exists primarily as a crisis and referral line for youths, runaways and their parents. It offers a line where you may talk on an anonymous basis if you wish, with an understanding person about the present crisis you are facing. The Lighthouse gives you information and makes referrals to community services and counseling agencies. It is also dedicated to raising the community awareness about the increase in the number of runaways and the need for coordinated efforts to minimize the stress between youths and parents, in order to prevent further runaways.
