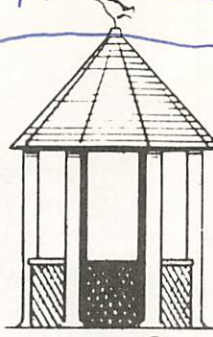

will be Drug Abuse, How To Recognize And Fight It.

The Civic League board has been receiving a growing number of reports of drug related incidents in the area. These include reports of young people openly selling drugs near the park and the intersection near the entrance to Pembroke Meadows. Two weeks ago a young man was found obviously under the influence of some type of drug at 10:00a.m. in the morning lying in the median strip.

While it would be naive to believe that Pembroke Meadows can be free of the ever-increasing drug problem, it is another matter to assume we cannot or should not make the effort to combat drug abuse. This is not another problem in another city or state, or one to be experienced by people we will never see or know. This problem exists in our community and is being experienced by our own children or the children of neighbors. This is not something that only happens to someone else. If you have teenage children or even pre-teens, come to the meeting and learn what you can do to help!
