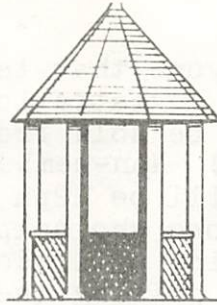

In the face of the obvious lack of concern, the Board has valiantly decided to press on and pursue the establishment of the "Neighborhood Watch Program" for Pembroke Meadows and adjacent neighborhoods.

Not only is it possible to set up a full-scale protection system, but it is also highly recommended. The average amount taken in a burglary is \$500.00. Can you afford to lose \$500 worth of personal property if your house is broken into?

We can have the best security program in Virginia Beach but everybody has to do their share. Initially, we have to have just a few people who are concerned about their homes or their neighbor's homes. One on each block will be enough to get the ball rolling. This one person will be indoctrinated in conducting home security inspections and assist the residents on their block in marking personal property for identification. The block captain will also be responsible for distributing information to the residents on their block from time to time.

It is our intention to organize and operate a highly efficient and functional block security program for our area.
