#### "<u>NO</u> NEW FEES — LOTS OF NEW MEMBERS!"

MONEY, MONEY!! Where does it all go? Our Civic League operating costs for the 1989 amounted to \$1660.94. That looks like a lot until compared to our <u>proposed</u> budget of \$1952.00 for 1989. Now there's a twist – we were under budget! But wait – there are some important details. The 1989 projection was based on 254 memberships in the Civic League and we took only <u>185</u>. So how did we end up in the black?

First there was a healthy \$874.00 balance brought forward from the previous year, due to our directory advertising drive. Then there was a belt-tightening: volunteer-hour increases and occasional city-provided mowing which helped eliminate many potential bills for median and entrance-way maintenance. We were fortunate.

Now looking to 1990, we see higher projection of need: \$2551.00. Volunteers can help again and those belts can tighten another notch, but the real secret to a balanced budget is <u>better membership</u>. If we can increase numbers, we can avoid increasing <u>fees</u>. More importantly, we will have a more involved, more supportive community, not a grumbling, gone—broke set of spectators. Actually, \$7.00 a year is probably one of the very last great American bargains, and we can preserve it only with <u>involvement</u>.

So, to keep 1990 membership fees at their current level, we need 375 Civic League memberships. Their involvement will help:

- keep the entrance—way to our community and recreation center neat and attractive.
- keep the park and lake shoreline groomed and debris-free.
- provide a quality monthly newsletter to the entire community, (Yes, non-members too!).
- pay annual city taxes.

## idening Of Tew Moped Helmet Law Independence Blvd.

Independence Blvd. (Phase IV)

The City commences survey and design work this month on the widening of Independence Blvd. to 6 lanes from Jeanne Street to Haygood Road, (Phase IV). Construction work on this widening, originally scheduled to begin next year, has recently been moved back to early 1993 because of funding problems.

Because of our neighborhoods' considerable

interest in the growing traffic congestion on Independence, our Civic League will be closely following the planning developments of this Phase IV widening project. For this purpose, our Civic League arranged a meeting last month with the City Engineer and planning officers, along with representatives of the other civic leagues and businesses along this stretch of Independence.

The City officials were agreeable to our consensus requests for the following design specifications: sidewalks on both sides, a bikeway on one side, attractive landscaping along the sides and median, an appropriate bridge structure over Lake

Pembroke with attractive landscape and screening and minimum disruption of the lake, etc. The City Engineer also assured that we will be kept informed of future planning developments of this project. Additional details will be reported at future Civic League meetings, and a public hearing will be planned later this year or early in 1991.


Our thanks to the good neighbors who take turns keeping an eye on our entranceway and picking up the litter there. Assignments for January 1st thru February 15th, are:

#### embroke Area Central **Business District**

The future development of a Central Business District (CBD) in the Pembroke area is a subject of considerable interest to our community and other nearby neighborhoods. Recently, the Central Business District Association (CBDA) has prepared a "Concept Plan" for such a development, and said plan has been endorsed by the City Council.. (The CBDA comprises approximately 150 local businesses and organizations; our Civic League is a member thereof).

In its endorsement of the CBD concept, City Council authorized funds for the preparation of a CBD Master Plan and appointed an eleven-member commission to provide input to and monitor the Master Plan preparation. Issues to be addressed in the Master Plan include: boundaries of the CBD, land use, zoning, densities, traffic, parking, financing, fiscal/economic factors, utilities, land-and-streetscaping, business and facilities desired and the impact of the CBD on neighboring communities and the environment. Our Civic League President, Jim Willenbrink, has been appointed a member of this CBD Commission...

Developments in planning for the CBD will be briefly reported at future Civic League meetings and a copy of the Concept Plan document will be displayed for anyone interested.
