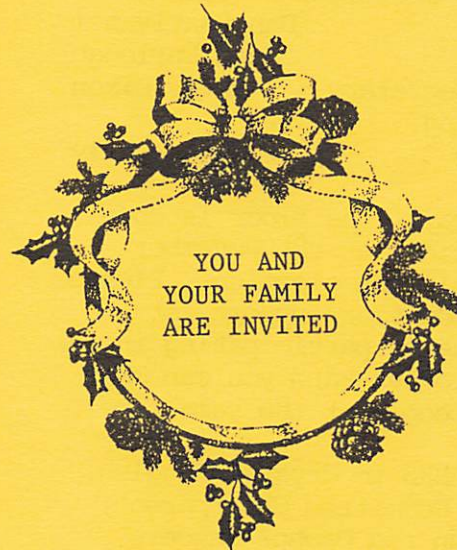

BEWARE HOME IMPROVEMENT SCAM ARTISTS

At our October Civic league meeting Cathy Parks of the Commonwealth's Attorney's Consumer Protection Division offered some tips for protecting ourselves from unscrupulous contractors and "conmen." Of paramount importance is to have a contract specifying expected date of starting and completion with penalty clauses for noncompliance. Note that for any job solicited in your home, you have a right to cancel in three (3) days. Make sure any contractor is licensed and registered with the state. Any guarantees and warranties will be void if the business should go bankrupt--it is important to check the contractor's references as well as with the Better Business Bureau and the Consumer Protection Division (427-8983) to see if any complaints have been lodged in the recent past. # Pembrook Meadows Pool News For 1991

Pool membership doesn't change much for 1991, but we have made a few changes in response to suggestions from some of the members. For 1991, new members will have an option of joining the pool in one of two different plans. They choose the plan that best fits their needs. Members that have joined under the old plan (listed below as Plan A) will remain under Plan A.

Plan A is the same plan that members have joined under for years. This plan includes 50% of the initiation fee plus the membership dues in the first year fee. A small savings can be realized if all of the \$225 initiation fee is paid in the first year.

Family Membership  
\$118 initiation fee  
\$210 dues  
\$328 total

Single Membership  
\$118 initiation fee  
\$100 dues  
\$218 total

Plan B is designed for new members who either want to join the pool on a trial basis or plan to be in the area for a short time (approximately two years or less). The fee for the first three years is shown below. The annual membership fee for the fourth and all following years is the same as Plan A.

Family Membership  
\$300 total

Single Membership  
\$190 total

As always, no matter which Plan you choose, there is a discount of \$20 for family, \$10 for single if all fees are paid in full by April 30, 1991.
