INDEPENDENCE BOULEVARD WIDENING

This is a follow-up report on the Phase IV-A widening of Independence Blvd. to six lanes from Jeanne Street north to Pembroke Blvd:

- Construction will commence sometime in October at the Jeanne Street end and will work northward.
- Duration of work is expected to be one year.
- 3) Present outer lanes will be closed while widening across walks and into Lake Pembroke. However, to alleviate traffic, two temporary narrow lanes will be constructed in the present median strip (one lane each side.) The medians will be restored after the new outer lanes are completed.
- 4) The 5-foot curvelinear bikeway/sidewalk has been restored in the plan. This "greenway" with appropriate landscaping, will result in a "parkway-like" appearance.
- 5) A crosswalk across Independence Blvd. will be located on the south side of Pembroke Blvd. (near Cenit Bank.)
- 6) A right turn lane on Pembroke Blvd., exiting Pembroke Meadows will be constructed to help reduce the delay at the light, i.e., we will then

have a left turn lane, a straight ahead lane, and a right turn lane at our gazebo.

- 7) concerning Lake Pembroke:
- a) five storm water retention ponds will be constructed along Independence Blvd., four on the east side and one on the west side. These will vary in size from about 380 feet to 60 feet in length/width. Three of these ponds will be dry most of the time; the other two will have a foot or two of water most of the time. These ponds will be fenced. Their purpose is to provide temporary containment and filtration of storm water runoff to reduce pollution and flooding of Lake Pembroke.
- b) during construction all trees and vegetation will have to be removed, unfortunately, from the overpass. About 30 feet of fill will be added on each side of the overpass.
- c) sediment fences will be placed during construction to prevent sedimentation in the Lake.
- d) landscape shrubs and trees will be replanted after construction is complete; but obviously the overpass will be relatively barren for quite some time and some additional traffic noise will reverberate across the lake.

Our Civic League has been in touch with the Public Works Department, City Engineer, City Landscaper, and others concerning this project. In fact, items 4, 5, 6 and part of 7 above resulted mostly from our specific requests. This is another example of the value of a good Civic League. We also again acknowledge the help of our Bayside Councilman Louis Jones in facilitating our liaison with the City.



PARENTS ---- A LETTER FROM YOUR NEIGHBORS

Throughout the summer months, we have noticed with increased frequency the number of small children who are totally left to their own devices when riding vehicles, playing ball, or skating. Cambria Street, Abbey Drive, and even Pembroke Boulevard have this problem, and so do many other streets. Parents, are you aware that children on bikes verbally bait you to hit them? Do you know that some of them purposely swerve their bikes, skateboards, and roller skates/blades in front of oncoming vehicles, causing the drivers to slam on brakes in order to avoid serious accidents? Are you aware that your 4 and 5 year olds occupy electric cars in the middle of the street with no regard for adult traffic as they dodge in and out of parked vehicles and into the paths of moving vehicles? What about those who refuse to stop a ball game in the middle of the street, forcing oncoming traffic to try to maneuver around them. while the children continue to play and run around the car even as it is moving? How can a driver predict in which direction a child will dart next?

Parents, take some sort of responsibility. Children, do the same. There is an accident just waiting to happen. Teach your children how to ride a bike safely, to play ball in a park or in a fenced yard, and not in the middle of the street. Certainly, teach older ones not to bait drivers with their verbal taunts, for one day they may unwittingly cause themselves great injury. No driver wants to hit a child, ever! But you and the child must use good judgement, too, in avoiding those situations which can lead to this terrible possibility.

CIVIC LEAGUE HAS VOTED TO WITHDRAW FROM CCO!

Last month's newsletter reported that our Civic League Officers had voted unanimously to withdraw from the Council of Civic Organizations (CCO.) (See July/August newsletter, page 3.) As reported, comments and votes were requested from any and all Civic League members by telephone or otherwise. The results were: 59 votes for withdrawal, 0 against. We will send a letter of withdrawal to the CCO stating that our Civic League "prefers not to be associated with the CCO unless and until new leadership of the CCO shall

reassure its members that in the future, violation of its constitution will not be willfully and knowingly tolerated."


On the issue of May's referendum vote, from which the CCO's improper actions mainly derived, some of our member voters did not express an opinion. But well over forty stated that they agreed with the board's consensus that we strongly support equal population reapportionment of our council burroughs, but we are against adoption of a ward system (which would deprive us of our current right to vote on six of our eleven Council members.)
