VIRGINIA BEACH CITY CODE

REQUIREMENTS: The following is reprinted from the brochure provided by the Virginia Beach Department of Housing and Neighborhood Preservation, Code Enforcement Division.

Sec. 31-1: Receptacles: areas not serviced by automated collection equipment shall use metallic or plastic containers with tight fitting lids, or tightly secured plastic bags.

Sec. 23-48: Open Storage of Junk: Rusted, junked, dilapidated machinery, equipment, material, etc. is prohibited from being stored outside.

Sec. 31-28: Points of Collection: Receptacles are to be placed on curbline by 7:00 a.m. on collection day, no earlier than 5:00 p.m. the preceding day, and removed out of view after collection on same day.

Sec. 31-377: Inoperative Vehicles on Private Property: The following conditions constitute a violation: (a) Vehicle not in operating condition (wrecked or junked). (b) Vehicle partially or totally dissembled by removal of essential parts required for operation. (c) Vehicle has neither valid license plates nor a valid inspection decal displayed. For more information concerning these code violations, you may call 427-4421.

COMMON PROPERTY MAINTENANCE VIOLATIONS

- Overgrowth of weeds or grass on vacant or developed lots (including easements behind townhouses)
- Accumulations of trash and junk
- Dead or diseased tree hazards
- Inoperative vehicles on private property
- Waste Management violations involving storage or disposal of refuse
- Illegal dumping


