With the beautiful snow we had in January, and the milder temperatures we are now experiencing, the humid summer warmth seems a distant concern. That time, however, will sneak up on us. We are fortunate, though, that we live in this Pembroke Meadows community, as we have quick access to the antidote to summer's heat: the neighborhood pool.

To the new neighbors and those who have never joined the pool, our secluded pool, surrounded by a wooded area across from the neighborhood park, is a wonderful way to while away the summer days and evenings. Not only does the pool provide a place for exercise and recreation, but also it is a friendly atmosphere to meet neighbors and a safe environment for kids to play.

There are many activities already planned for this summer's season: family nights, youth nights, a youth spend-the-night, cookouts, a Parrot head adult social, Fourth of July activities, and my favorite, a Christmas in July party (I just love the Christmas cookie contest—got milk?). The pool boasts a horseshoe pit, a basketball hoop, and a volleyball net.

There are swimming lessons offered at the pool. Many a neighborhood kid has learned to swim at the pool. Living in Hampton Roads, the ability to swim is essential. Most of our lifeguard staff is returning from last summer, providing safety and experience in teaching kids to swim.

The pool is home to the Pembroke Meadows Marlins Swim Team, which is part of the Virginia Beach Swim League. The swim team is for those aged 5 to 18. Participation on the swim team is a great way to insure your children exercise during the summer. The excitement of competition and the esprit de corps of teamwork make the swim team a wonderfully fun experience. All team members swim in the five regular meets of the summer, regardless of skill, but all kids improve their skill levels during the season. Returning as coach this summer is Shannon Cutshall, a member of the 1984 Olympic Swim Team. Also returning, as team representatives, are Carol and Bob Weinstein (464-6351). A notice of the dates for swim team sign ups will be included in the next newsletter.

Inside this newsletter is a copy of the 2000 membership application. The fees charged by the pool are the cheapest you can find for a private pool in this area. Only Carolanne Farms community pool comes close. There is a 10% discount if paid by April 30. For the cost of a few days out of town, your family can have an entire summer enjoying the pool. The pool is administered as a labor of love by a voluntary board. Planning goes on all year long. In the plans are a deleafing of the deck and the Spring Fling. All volunteers are welcome. The deleafing is scheduled for Saturday, March 25 at 10 a.m. Spring Fling will be April 29th. This is a happenin' event that you won't want to miss! So mark your calendar.


