ATTENTION: BLACK SNAKES

Be aware! There have been Virginia black snakes sightings in the Pembroke Shores

Area. I saw a dead one that was over five feet in length and one which was smaller, only three feet. These snakes are
usually found near water but also like cool, tall grassy locations. To keep them away from your yard, keep grass cut and
don't let trash or debris build up. Cool dark places are what they prefer for nesting. I've been told their bite is not
poisonous but will cause swelling. This notice is not meant to alarm anyone but don't allow a perfect habitat for these
snakes to form around your home.

PET LOST AND FOUND We in Pembroke Meadows, Shores and Townhouses have established a pet lost and found service that works very well in our community. If your pet gets lost in the Meadows, call Jim at 497-0400, if lost in the Shores, call Belinda at 490-2504. Most of our neighbors are aware of the program and do call to report lost/found pets. We have on file most of the pets with pictures for ID. It's as simple as looking in the file and finding the description given and making the call to reunite a pet with its owner. Hundreds of pets have been returned using this procedure. Some residents are not aware of this service and unfortunately, animal control is called to pick up the pet because a file has not been created for it. If there is a tag on the animal, we do trace it.

This saves the owner the time and expense of travelling to the local kennel to pick it up. Help us to return your beloved pets and register your cat, dog, rabbit, bird, reptile, etc. They all roam off at one time or another. Pets are especially afraid during storms and if they run off they may lose their sense of returning home. Be aware of where your pets are in an upcoming storm. Thank you to all who have called to report a lost or found pet.

Overabundance of Bacteria in Chesapeake Bay and Tributaries

A recent Chesapeake Bay Journal reports unusually large populations of bacteria in the bay and local waterways and emphasizes the importance of preventing excessive nutrients (e.g. lawn fertilizers, animal/duck feces, grass and shrub clippings, leaves, etc.) from entering our lakes and waterways. "Such an overabundance of bacteria could have serious implications for cleanup efforts, which are aimed at reducing nutrients to improve dissolved oxygen levels in the water. Nutrients fuel algae growth and when there is more algae than can be consumed by fish and other species, the excess dies and is decomposed by bacteria." I hope to have our Pembroke Lakes and Lake Meadows tested for ecoli bacteria in the near future. HELPING THE SHAD via "shad ladder" on the Lake Pembroke spillway is our effort to increase the fish population, particularly the minnows, thus reducing algae, bacteria and other micro-organisms in our waterways. The shad ladder has been moderately successful in helping the anadromous shad migrate and spawn in the lake. Through the efforts of the "shad dads," Roy Awbrey, Earl Davis, Jim Willenbrink, and Lou Williams diligently working with nets and buckets, about 70 large stranded shad were returned to their spawning areas in Lake Meadows. Thanks from the shad, and perhaps a couple thousand minnows!

<u>HAVE YOU NOTICED THE LARGE STUMP IN THE MEDIAN?</u> A pine tree was struck by lightning and was severely weakened. Therefore, the City removed it.




