NEXT CIVIC LEAGUE MEETING AT 7:00 ON THURSDAY, February 21 IN THE SCHOOL CAFETERIA! (Note the starting time of 7:00 p.m.!)

Our homes were built in the 60s with aluminum wiring. Is this a reason for concern? The answer could be yes. Some owners have replaced their wiring and receptacles with copper while others may not be aware of the need for safety checks. Learn how you can find out more, talk with an electrician and get more in formation at the Civic League meeting. BUILDING AND GROUNDS PROTECT YOUR INVESTMENT

We, as homeowners, devote a lot of time, effort and money to maintaining our homes and yards. The purchase of a home is usually the largest investment anyone makes in a lifetime, so abiding by the City Zoning Ordinances that relate to subdivisions is a responsibility that each resident/homeowner should want to uphold.

How our community looks as one drives through the area does reflect on the real estate values so lets ALL do our part in abiding by those regulations that help insure that we remain a neighborhood that is sought out by potential home buyers.

One area that seems to cause some confusion is the parking of commercial vehicles in a residential area.

The code reads as follows:

Commercial Vehicular Parking. Parking of a commercial vehicle in residential or apartment districts shall be prohibited, except that one (1) commercial vehicle of (1) ton or less in carrying capacity and which does not exceed seven (7) feet in height or twenty (20) feet in length may be parked on any lot where there is located a main building by a resident of the premises. This restriction shall not apply to commercial vehicles during the normal conduct of business or in the delivery or provision of service to a residential area. The parking of semi trailers for commercial or industrial storage is prohibited except on bonafide construction sites. (This means a commercial vehicle of one ton or less and less than 7 feet in height or less than 20 feet in length is prohibited from parking on the street but may park in the driveway of the premises of the residence.)

Parking of any and all utility trailers on the streets is PROHIBITED.

There are specific regulations regarding signs. Before placing a sign, be sure you are aware of what the sign ordinance permits.

Neighborhood Watch Program



We recently had a vandalism incident at about 10:30pm one evening in our neighborhood. The homeowner reported that several individuals broke into his fenced back yard, broke windows and damaged several pieces of expensive equipment. The homeowner reported the occurrence to the police and is awaiting resolution of the case.

Homeowners should consider upgrading their back yard lighting and the installation of motion detection lights to illumine back yard areas. Of course, we must continue to watch out for one another and continue to report suspicious activity to our police department.

Pet Responsibility

Why do indoor cats need vaccines?

Rabies vaccination is required by Virginia law for all cats over four months of age. This law is designed to protect you and your family against this deadly untreatable disease. If your cat is not up to date and bites someone, even if it is because he or she is hurt, the Health Department may insist that your cat be euthanized and tested for rabies. A woman in Northern Virginia was exposed to rabies last year after her unvaccinated indoor cat killed a bat in her house. The cat bit her while she was putting her in a carrier to go to the vet. Her life was saved because her veterinarian insisted on testing the cat.

Indoor cats can contact upper respiratory infections from items coming into the house that have virus from a sick cat on them. A friend with a sick kitten could accidentally infect your cat even though the kitten never came into your house. Indoor cats also go to groomers, boarding facilities and veterinary hospitals where they can come into contact with sick cats. If your cat is already sick or hurt and in the hospital he or she is already weaker and stressed, so vaccinations will protect against these contacts.

Feline Leukemia vaccine is also recommended because many indoor cats slip outside when small children and repairmen don't close the doors carefully.




