
The Annual Pot Luck Supper was a fun time for all! The food was better than ever and the SILENT AUCTION was fun for everyone!







**Nutria Warning** 



This member of the rodent family is native to South America, and it was introduced both accidentally and purposely in the waterways in several American states. The species has proved to be overly destructive of habitat in some areas, creating problems for muskrats and waterfowl.

There are now confirmed reports that nutria have inhabited our Lake Meadows and Lake Pembroke.

Nutria are very large rodents (body-length) about two feet plus rat-like tails). Because they feed primarily on vegetation, even chewing up the roots of aquatic and shoreline plants and because they burrow large holes near the banks of waterways, and as they propagate rapidly with few predatory enemies, nutria are devastating the entire ecology of many wetlands areas. Most biologists who have studied the problem now recommend that nutria populations should be eradicated. (A recent frontpage article in the Virginia Pilot, reported on the nurria destruction of the Back Bay wetlands and the resulting depletion of fish, crab, birds and other animal populations).

Specifically, one large nutria was recently observed in our park strolling around the playground area near children. As nutria are largely nocturnal and retiring creatures (like rats), I would be wary that such unusual and unabashed behavior of a nutria might indicate a sick (perhaps rabid) animal that could be danger our to humans or pets which it might confront. #### **BAYSIDE HISTORY TRAIL**

On Saturday, May 18th of this year, the fourth annual Bayside History Trail will be held. The City of Virginia Beach earned a National award for Community Service, the LERN Award. We can feel proud of the fact that we were part of it. Our community is centered in three of the points of interest of the nine points listed in the brochure. The sites are: Ferry Plantation House, Old Donation Church, Lynnhaven House, Haygood United Methodist Church Chapel, Adam Thoroughgood House, Pembroke Manor House, and Morning Star Baptist Church. The other significant three sites are Witchduck Point, Second Courthouse Site- on the Old Donation Church site, and First Church Site at Church Point. All sites are in Bayside and can be reached by jogging, bicycle, and car. Some can even be reached by the waterway.

Refreshments will be served outdoors at some of the locations.

The city magazine the BEACH will be featuring the Bayside History Trail in a fall issue this year. The city photographer will be taking pictures of each of the seven sites. Those visiting the sites may find themselves in the magazine.

Section 23-48 of the City Code states that it is unlawful for any person to place or leave on any property in the City any dilapidated furniture, appliance, machinery, equipment, building material or other item; which is either in wholly or partially rusted, wrecked, junked, dismantled or inoperative condition and which is not completely enclosed within a building. This ordinance does not apply to any licensed junk dealers or establishments engaged in the repair, rebuilding, reconditioning or salvaging of equipment.

Most junk violations are reported by citizens. If the inspector determines that a property is not in compliance with the code, a notice of violation is sent to the owner allowing 7 days to correct the violations.

If violations are not corrected within the time allowed, the City may have the junk removed by a contractor, especially if the property is vacant. The case usually will be handled through court action if the property is occupied. If the removal work is contracted, the owner will be billed for the cost of the work. Failure to pay the bill will result in a lien placed against the property.
