# **Grace Sherwood Statue Unveiling**

The statue of Grace Sherwood, Virginia's only convicted witch tried by water, will be unveiled on **Saturday, April 21st at 10am** on the lawn of Bayside Hospital, 800 Independence Blvd. The statue will be placed near the corner of Independence Blvd. and North Witchduck Rd. She will be within two tenths of a mile of the old Second Princess Anne Courthouse of 1706, the court that tried Grace many times. She stands one mile West of her ducking point in Witchduck Bay.

Grace lays claim to Witchduck Road, Witchduck Point, Sherwood Lane, and many of our local streets and sites. After 300 years, to the hour of 10am, Grace Sherwood was exonerated by Governor Timothy Kaine. A plaque of Governor Kaine's exoneration will be placed at the base of the staute. Another plaque will tell of Grace's trials and tribulations from the late 1600's through 1706.

A final plaque will display our donors which will include \$10,000 Platinum level, \$5,000 Gold level, \$3,000 Silver level, and \$1,000 Bronze level. # **HAS YOUR HOME APPRECIATED IN VALUE?**

New appraisals went out in March. How did your home measure up? Let's take a moment and go back in time. Back to when our homes were first built by the Terry Corporation in 1967/68...

The original prices ranged from \$17,900--\$23,000 including the land.

Your house came complete with carpet in dining room & living room only. All other floors were tiled. Wallpaper of your choice was included in foyer, kitchen and baths.

Family rooms were paneled in wood grain masonite.

### Of course there were additional options offered.

Whole house air conditioning--\$1,050 --\$1,450 depending on the model you chose.

A fireplace was going to add another \$600-\$700 depending on the model.

Want a 10x24 ft concrete patio and patio door? It would cost \$300.

Storm windows and doors installed ran \$260. --\$400 depending on the model

Want solid oak strip floors on second floor – add \$325-\$425

A fully finished second floor on the Fairfax model (A frame) complete with full bath, closets, 2 bedrooms, and all electrical/heating/air conditioning would run you **\$1,900** 

Want another family room instead of the garage? Add another \$500. This price included insulation, paneled walls, electric (1 outlet) on all walls, heating, air conditioning, windows and tile floor.


Want waterfront property? It would cost an additional \$2,000 per lot.

Typical monthly house payment including mortgage, taxes, fire and homeowners insurance, FHA insurance where applicable ran less than \$200. per month.

(Taxes took up \$24. per month –or about \$288. per year.)

Since this was the first "Totally Electric" development our average electric bill which included heating, air conditioning, appliances and lights ran approximately \$25.00 per month. Wow, what a difference!
