Thinking about kayaking? Always wanted to give it a try?
Come to the Pembroke Meadows Kayak Demo Day!
June 21 from 3pm until 7pm at the lake next to the Recreation Center What a great way to test paddle an assortment of kayaks! Wild River Outfitters staff will be on hand to explain the differences in designs and help select a kayak that is appropriate for your comfort and paddling

style. Take advantage of this opportunity to learn about the sport and test drive different kayaks. The demo fee is \$5 per paddler if you register in advance and \$10 per paddler for walkins the day of the Demo. Pre-registered participants will be given priority ahead of walk-ins the day of the demo. For safety reasons paddlers must be at least 8 years old and weigh at least 65 lbs. All children 13 years old or younger must be accompanied by their parent or guardian. Pembroke Meadows Recreation Center is exploring the interest in providing organized beginner kayak lessons during the summer.
