PLEASE DON'T FEED THE GEESE

The Canada goose population in our community has increased substantially. While the birds are beautiful and we tend to embrace wildlife, they bring a lot of negatives!

Each goose eats 3 pounds of grass per day and leaves 1 to 3 pounds of messy droppings. A small flock can cause substantial damage to a grassy area over a short time, leaving you with a mess of droppings.

The droppings are harmful to our lakes and rivers. Mixed with storm water run-off, the feces cause excessive algae to grow in the water – posing a threat to aquatic life.

The droppings also contain parasites and bacteria that can cause intestinal illness. Our children and pets are potentially at risk. Make sure you promptly and thoroughly clean any goose droppings that come in contact with your shoes or hands.

In summary, don't feed the geese. They will do fine without our help!

As a resident in Virginia Beach it is the law and your responsibility to:

Keep all sidewalks **clear** of any encroachments such as grass, flowers, bushes, tree limbs and shrubs.

Remove any limbs below 6 1/2 ft in height that overhang the sidewalk.

Clean the gutters in front of your home (and side if on a corner lot)

Remember, anything that is in the gutter ends up in the lake. That includes trash, debris, fertilizer, pesticides, etc.

Vehicles blocking the sidewalk create dangerous problems for pedestrians, children, wheelchairs, walkers, strollers and tricycles. Parking legally at the curb is only a few feet away.

FRAUD ALERT!

From the Virginia Beach Consumer Affairs Program

BEWARE OF HOME "HELP"

The Consumer Affairs Program has received reports from Virginia Beach citizens who have been contacted by a woman posing as an employee of Social Services. Consumers stated the woman had information about their situation and possible need for in-home services. An additional call and an unsolicited personal visit came from the person seeking to provide those services.

BE SAFE:

- Never let someone you don't know into your home.
- Never give information to someone you don't know over the phone.
- Any person employed by the City of Virginia Beach will have official identification.
- If you receive any similar calls, contact Adult Protective Services at 437-3550

TIPS FOR CHOOSING IN-HOME CARE:

- Assess your needs. Do you need health care, non-medical personal care, or help with housecleaning or managing money?
- Make sure the person you hire has the appropriate licenses and insurance.
- Require a criminal background check.
- Check references.
- Develop a job contract with wages, work hours, etc.
- Monitor the quality of the services.
