Ferry Plantation House History Camp

Would you like to spend a week or two having fun? Would you like to live for a week like your great grandparents lived? Care to dig in an authentic archeological site for treasures and trash from the past on Mondays thru Thursdays? It is just for a week but it is a barrel of laughs and lots of adventure.

Help make a rug on a centuries old wooden loom, or carve soap with wooden dowels, wash laundry outside on an antique scrub board, learn how soap was made, bake bread in an outside oven, pump water from the well with old hand pump, make crafts, learn about dendrochronology, participate in the School of the Sailor with members of the Coast Guard, make jerky from scratch, get dirty? Any of these sound interesting?

Basic Camp: August 17-21st

In Advance Camp you can become a Confederate Soldier if you pass the physical and instructions. Eat lunch with the Confederate soldiers and ask them about the Civil War at "School of the Soldier". Of course you will have to make a haversack, roll bandages for the wounded, and learn about making hardtack. You will make salve for the wounds from herbs in our gardens and make cords for your haversack. Also, you will be assigned parts for a play about "The First Landing in 1607". Learn about hides and their uses. Wash laundry outside on antique scrub boards with homemade soaps. You will dye wool, learn about flax and spinning, crafts and an archeological dig on Mondays thru Thursdays.

What You Need to Know About Sweepstakes

✓ Don't Pay to Win

Buying magazines and other products does not increase your chances of winning. Never pay taxes or fees to receive your winnings.

✓ Participating in Prize Promotions Will Put Your Name on Lists

Con artists buy and sell leads on people who play sweepstakes. If you play, your name may appear on "sucker" or "mooch" lists and you'll be targeted for fraud. To reduce your risk for fraud, stop playing sweepstakes and don't talk to telemarketers – it's that simple!

✓ Reduce Sweepstakes and Other Junk Mail/E-mail

Send a letter to: Mail Preference Service, P.O. Box 643, Carmel, NY 10512, or register online at: www.dmaconsumers.org/consumerassistance.html.

✓ Don't Play Canadian and Out-of-State Lotteries

It's illegal under federal law to sell and purchase foreign lotteries in the U.S. It is also illegal to sell and purchase lottery products over state lines.

✓ Don't Fall for Mailings or Callers That Appear Official

Promoters use mailings with pseudo government logos and official looking statements to persuade you that the promotions are legitimate.

Telemarketers will lie and claim to be a government official or attorney as well.

✓ Keep Credit Card, Bank and Personal Information to Yourself

Never give your credit card number, bank account information, or social security number to anyone who calls or e-mails you, especially if it is to verify your eligibility or to "deposit" your winnings into your account.
