PROPERTY VALUES

(Although retired from an active role in the real estate world, I try to "stay on top of" our neighborhood property sales transactions.)

Four properties changed ownership since Bob Schultz, my former real estate partner and advertiser in this newsletter, and I discussed market activity in Pembroke Meadows and Shores last month.

A waterfront home in the Shores listed at \$365,000 and sold for \$345,000 after 189 days on the market. The rebuilt home on Hudgins Drive, destroyed by a previous fire, sold for \$305,900.

Two 5-bedroom homes listed at \$315,00 and \$275,000 sold for \$305,000 and \$267,000 respectively. The latter home sold in just three days!



FRAUD ALERT!

SEEING THROUGH STIMULUS SCAMS With talk of stimulus plans ruling the news, it's no surprise a new round of stimulus scams are afoot.

Here's how it goes: An email, online ad, or website says you're eligible to get an economic stimulus payment. You just have to send back a form or submit one online to get it. The message might appear to come from a rebate company or look like it's straight from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). But the promise of stimulus money in return for a fee or financial information is always a scam, according to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), the nation's consumer protection agency. There's more than one way to perpetuate a stimulus scam.

Some scam artists as you to send a small processing fee, supposedly to get a much larger check in return. That's money you'll never see again. Others skip the fee, and instead, ask for your bank account number so they can "deposit" your check. Then they use the information to clean out your account or open new ones using your indentifying information.

Some stimulus scams encourage you to click on links, open attached forms, or call phony toll-free numbers. But simply clicking the link or opening the document can install harmful software, like spyware, on your computer. The results could be your personal information ending up in the hands of an identity thief.

If you get a message offering you money from the stimulus program in exchange for your personal information, ignore it, delete it, or throw it out. The IRS doesn't send emails like this asking for personal information and rebate companies claiming to have stimulus payment for you should not be trusted, regardless of how plausible the script sounds or how official the form looks.

When a stimulus plan does involve a check to you (it may not) you won't need to fill out a separate from in an email or give out personal information – like account numbers or your Social Security number – to someone who calls you out of the blue.

So, if you get unexpected email from someone claiming to be from the IRS and asking you to call a number or email back personal information, don't do it. Forward any suspicious emails to phishing@irs.gov, then delete it without opening any attachments. If you think you are a target of a scam, you can also file a complaint with the Federal Trade Commission at ftc.gov/complaint.

The Pembroke Meadows, Pembroke Shores and Townhomes Civic League meets regularly at the Pembroke Meadows Elementary School. Our meetings begin promptly at 7:00 p.m., include a guest speaker of interest to our community, light refreshments and neighborhood news/concerns updates.

YOUNG OR INJURED WILDLIFE

Recently a very young squirrel was found in our neighborhood. The animal was badly dehydrated and wouldn't have lived through the night without help.

If you find a young or injured animal: Orphaned or injured wildlife may be brought to the Virginia Beach SPCA during operating hours. It is located at 3040 Holland Road, phone # 427-0072.

Receiving hours are: Mon, Fri & Sat 10 AM to 3:30 PM

Tue & Thurs 12:30 PM to 5 PM Sun: 1 PM to 3:30 PM

After hours, a message line may be called to be put the caller in touch with an after-hours volunteer that will assist in locating a rehabilitator to care for the animal. The after-hours Wildlife Referral number is: 263-4762. You will need to transport the animal as pick up services are not provided.

After finding a young animal, you should:

- Place the baby in a softly-lined covered box with ventilation
- Place the box in a warm, dark, quiet, indoor location away from humans and pets
- Do not attempt to feed or water, no matter how much the animal begs
- Make arrangements to transport the bird or mammal to a permitted facility or rehabilitator as soon as possible


