

BULKY TRASH PICKUP

Bulky item collection service for normal household discards is provided, free of charge, for residents who receive waste collection service from the City of Virginia Beach. Most of our household discards will be collected. The following will not be collected curbside: remodeling and building materials, carpet, doors, cabinets, sinks, rocks, dirt, concrete, vehicle parts, glass or hazardous materials.

Residents should request bulky item pickup service no later than 5 p.m. the workday before the regular trash collection day. Requests for the pickup of bulky items can be placed by calling 385-4650, by visiting VBgov.com, or by e-mailing astemgt@VBgov.com.

In order to process your request, a list of discarded items must be provided. Please mention in your request if you have a freon-containing appliance, as these items require special handling. Be sure to include your email address and phone number in case the City needs to contact you. Items should be placed at the curb by 7am on your regular collection day. Items should not be placed at the curb until the evening prior to pickup.
