PROPERTY VALUES

(Although retired from an active role in the real estate world, I try to "stay on top of" our neighborhood property sales transactions.)

Here is an update of the real estate picture since Bob Schultz, my former real estate partner and advertiser in this newsletter, and I reviewed market activity in Pembroke Meadows and Shores in November.

Currently two end unit town homes are being marketed at \$192,900 and 209,900. The sellers of a 4-bedroom/ 2+ ½ bath/1956 square foot home are asking \$299,000.

A 2488 square foot, 5 bedroom/3 bath home currently tax assessed at \$303,800 listed at \$242,300 sold for only \$172,500! It was marketed as a "short sale" and requiring a lot of work. The transaction was mentioned as "pending" in the November newsletter. Additionally, a 5 bedroom/2/5 bath/2615 square foot home sold for \$312,500.

Virginia Beach is working hard to create jobs and infrastructure with economic stimulus funds from the federal government. This will help boost the local economy during the current slump.

FRAUD ALERT!

From the Virginia Beach Consumer Affairs Program

Eventually, more than 140,000 U.S. Census workers will gather information about every person living at each address in the United States. Information for the 2010 Census includes name, age, gender, race, and other relevant data. Most people in the Hampton Roads area will receive a Census form by U.S. Mail in March 2010. A few remote locations and harder to contact households will be contacted in person beginning in January 2010. It is important to know how to tell the difference between a U.S. Census worker and a con artist.

U.S. Census workers will have a badge (no photo), a notebook, a black Census Bureau canvas bag with white lettering, and a confidentiality notice.

- Ask to see their identification and their badge before answering their questions. If you ask, the worker should provide you with a phone number to call to verify their employment with the Census.
- Never invite anyone you don't know into your home no matter who they say they are!
- There are only 10 questions on the official Census form.
- The Census Bureau will not ask for any financial information, such as a salary range, and will NOT ask for Social Security, bank account, or credit card numbers.
- Census workers will never ask for payment or contributions of any kind.
- Census workers may contact you at your home in person or by telephone only if you are in a hard to access situation or you did not return your mail-in form. They will NOT contact you by email.
