STREET LIGHTS AND STORM DRAINS

Jeff Brown asked that I pass on the following letter from the City of Virginia Beach as well as the request to let him know if you note a storm drain without a marker. He has a supply of the new markers and is happy to affix them as appropriate.

The City of Virginia Beach's Highway Operations Customer Service personnel receives and reports traffic related defects which include street light outages, pot holes, damaged traffic signs, broken curbs and sidewalks - their phone number is 385-1470. They are all very pleasant and helpful.

When reporting streetlight outages, please have citizens include the pole number, address and if the light is totally out or if it is going on and off. This information really helps the Dominion Virginia Power service persons in finding and fixing the lights.

Last year a number of street lights were upgraded in Pembroke Meadows on Hudgins Drive and some of the surrounding streets and this year 20 street lights are being upgraded on St. Martin Dr., St. Martin Ct., St. Mark Rd., St. Mark Ct., St. James Dr., St. James Ct., St. Clements Rd., St. Albans St., St. Luke St., and Temple Ct.

These upgrades involve Dominion Virginia Power changing the streetlight fixture from the older Mercury Vapor fixture (white light) to a High Pressure Sodium Vapor fixture (amber color light). The amber color lights actually throw a further spread of light than the white light. The new fixtures have flat lens refractors so light does not come into resident's windows. These lighting improvements are authorized to satisfy requests for more lighting in these areas, that were put on our back log list by residents in Pembroke Meadows.

Since your lighting is fed underground it is much more cost effective to do these upgrades than to add 1 new light and pole.

PHONE SCAM

Forwarded from Officer Dolly Deans, VBPD:

FYI. I received a call from a reverse mortgage representative with Wells Fargo Bank to make us aware of a local scam. A contractor is making visits to elderly people who need home repairs, he promises he will obtain financing for them through the bank, and has them sign a contract. Then when the senior is turned down for the loan and wants to back out the contractor is taking them to court for breach of contract. She said the scam is occurring at numerous locations through Hampton Roads and that the contractor is operating under a number of different company names.

The bank employee has made a report to APS, the police, and the FBI fraud unit.
