REAL ESTATE UPDATE

A couple of months have passed since my realtor, and former partner (and advertiser in this newsletter), Bob Schultz and I discussed real estate sales data for Pembroke Meadows/Shores/Townhomes.

In the last 60 days, there has not been much real estate activity, but the holiday season is historically slow. One 1470 sq foot townhome for sale at \$159,900 was "pending" in our last report and sold for \$145,000. Another townhome was on the market for \$164,000 was "under contract" as of December 14. Three townhomes remain for sale from \$178,500 to \$199,900.

Of the three single family homes on the market in November, one has been taken off the market and rented. Another, initially priced at \$285,000 has been reduced to \$279,900. Nothing new has entered the inventory.

We haven't mentioned rental before, but there are 2 townhomes available now for \$1095 and \$1295/month. Another has rented for \$1195/month.

There are a few groups in VA Beach that are perfect for seniors who wish to have a pleasant chat, listen to a speaker, go on an occasional trip, etc.

The largest <u>local</u> chapter (#4212) of the AARP meets on the second Wednesday of the month at the Kempsville Recreation Center. They offer speakers, light refreshments, an annual birthday party, an annual auction and flea market type sale, a day trip or two, and this year we had a fabulous Holiday dinner with entertainment. A similar but smaller group called the Kempsville Senior Citizens Group meets at the Central Library on the first Wednesday of the month. From these stories I learned how strong my club-friends are, to have lived their lives with such determination and focus in the face of adversity. And we laughed so hard we want to do it again someday.

With a different focus, a group called the Tidewater Antiques and Arts Club meets on the first Tuesday of the month at the Central Library. <u>I do not collect antiques</u> – the oldest things in my house are George and me – but I have loved hearing about the riches of Virginia each month and where to find them. At one meeting, I actually held a miniature book once owned by a founding father but I was so nervous I have forgotten which one! And the refreshments are especially good.

There is an offshoot group of the AARP for recent (you need to join within 2 years I think) widows and widowers. They share a special support that only those who have lost a spouse can understand.

There is a senior group that sings – they practice weekly – they have fun.

There is the Sentara Living Group that meets at the Bayside Presbyterian Church – I see several of you there – it is well worth the effort to go.

And don't forget our own Nan Norton's; "Nan's Knitting and Crochet group" that meets a few streets away on the first and third Saturdays of the month.

So if you are sitting around moaning and groaning that you feel lonely because your loved ones and friends have moved away or died, (or if you have a parent, grandparent, etc. who might need to find a group) then get out and try one of these groups. What do you have to lose?

And if you don't want to drive then call around and get two or three other ";crinklies" (British term for us oldsters) to come over for tea or coffee, maybe cards or checkers too. Let's make the most of the time we have left, kiddos! As my ex-sister-in-law Carol Ann says, "Wake up and do something. You'll have plenty of time to sleep when you die."
