

## 2011 PMCL membership reaches 157





# REAL ESTATE UPDATE

This information came from the data Realtor Bob Schultz provided for the neighborhood real estate activity in January.


The sole sale of the month was a townhome that changed owners for \$164,000 with seller financing.

The single family home bought at foreclosure, rehabbed, and initially marketed at \$285,000 is currently priced at \$269,900. As of this writing, it is the only single family home for sale in the neighborhood.

There are three townhomes on the market, with sellers asking \$132,000, \$178,500 and \$199,900.

Rents for 4 townhome rentals range from \$1095 to \$1295 per month.

#### **Aluminum Wire Hazards**

Aluminum electrical wire was popular when many of our homes were built around 1970. Unfortunately, it has proven to be a potential fire hazard and is no longer accepted for new installations. Whenever possible, aluminum wire should be replaced with copper. But for most of us, total replacement is out of the question so we have to find ways to live with aluminum wire. Here are a few suggestions:

- Always remind any electricians or handymen working on your home projects that you may have aluminum wire and they must use appropriate methods and devices when they connect anything to the existing aluminum wire.
- Always use connectors and devices approved for CU/ALR (Copper-Aluminum Revised) when replacing switches, receptacles and joining wires. Standard wirenuts are not approved for splicing aluminum wire. Only one connector is recommended, UL Listed and easily available: the "AlumiConn". (See: www.AlCopStore.com). Ideal Purple 65 twist-on connectors sold at HomeDepot are not recommended.
- Always discard older CU/AL switches and receptacles and replace them with new CU/ALR devices.
- Always use a short solid copper "pig-tail" when splicing aluminum wire to stranded copper wire. Stranded copper wire should never be joined directly to aluminum wire.
- Always use "No Ox", "Ox-Guard" or another suitable electrical oxide prevention grease when joining any aluminum wire conductors. This reduces the risk but isn't as good as replacing the aluminum wire with copper.
- Always be alert for flickering lights or receptacles/switches that are warm or show discoloration. This could signal a faulty connection that should be repaired.

Now is the time to start the planning for summer fun. Just thinking of the hot summer days and splashing in the pool makes




