





### **POOL NEWS**

Many thanks to all the current, paid civic league dues members present at the February Pot Luck Dinner who supported renewing the Stimulus Plan for the neighborhood recreation center (pool) for 2011. If you aren't familiar with this extraordinary deal, please allow me to explain.

Our Civic League receives monies from the T-Mobile cell tower on civic league property. The civic league members present at the February meeting voted to support every civic league member's (in good standing) 2011 pool membership.

So if you are current with your 2011 civic league dues (cost is only \$10.00 a year), you are eligible to receive a credit of \$100.00 on your annual 2011 pool membership.

Your recreation center board for the past THREE years has not raised membership rates. Our family

membership is \$425.00 (\$385.00 if paid in full by April 30). With the stimulus plan in effect again this year, that brings the membership rate down to \$325.00 (\$285.00 if paid by April 30). It sounds like a lot of money but truly it is a deal for all the fun and sun you receive. Plans are underway for the season's activities, and we want you there with us.

Many thanks to all those who supported the Spaghetti Dinner and Silent Auction. We had fun, ate a great meal and raised approximately \$1000.00 for our pool's needs. We couldn't do this without you. The Norfolk Florist cards also brought in about \$500.00 this year.

Spring Fling is the annual clean up of the neighborhood median, park, waterways, and pool grounds to get us looking good for the summer. This year the Spring Fling is scheduled to be held on May 14 (rain date May 15). We need everyone to come out and help tidy up and take off the cover of the pool. Free cookout at 11:30 for all the hands that help. We start at 8:00am for those early birds that want to "GET IT DONE".

### STREET WALKER WITH THE LITTLE RED WAGON UPDATE

Wow! The response for the food for the Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia has been "supercalifragilistic"! Here is the report to date:

The townhomes contributed 129 pounds and \$80.00 in checks. St. Albans, St. Marks and St. Luke streets donated 172 pounds and \$50.00. St. Martin and St. James donated 101 pounds and \$25.00.

The total is <u>410 pounds</u> of non-perishable food and \$150.00 in monetary donations. I have two streets

yet to canvass in the Shores and will then begin in the Meadows. The 2009 grand total for our community was 630 pounds of food and I was elated to collect that amount! Before the end of March, we will have <u>doubled</u> our 2009 contribution and the Street Walker will have only just begun in the Meadows. Do you understand why I say supercalifragilistic?

On March 12 or 13, (weather permitting), I will be on St. Clement and Temple Court. So watch for the Street Walker with the little red wagon. The following weekend I'll be on Abbey Arch, Bishop Drive, the east end of Cambria and Bishop back to Pembroke Boulevard.

### DO YOU KNOW?


That the posted speed limit on our neighborhood streets, including Pembroke Boulevard, is **25 MPH?** 

That a call to the Virginia Beach Public Works Dept at 385-1470 can get the repair cycle started on your heaving, broken and dangerous public sidewalk?

That to arrange a Bulky item trash pickup, you must call 385-4650?

(Editor's note: While we're thinking "Bulky" items for pickup, please be aware that it is the homeowner's/renter's responsibility to properly

dispose of items NOT retrieved during our weekly pickups. Specifically, if you place items at the curb that are not taken by our weekly pickup then you must remove them from the curb and arrange for other disposal.)



#### THINK LIKE A BURGLAR

Most of us don't think like a thief so we leave ourselves exposed. Here are some suggestions to minimize the impact if a burglar should break into your home.

Burglar: "Oh look at that nice row of keys hanging by the door. The cars, shed, spare house keys. I'll grab them now and come back later!" Suggestion: Put keys in a secure place or at least out of sight. Having locks re-keyed is a pain.

Burglar: "Aha! A fireproof lock-box. Bet it's got some valuables in it. I'll grab it now and check inside later." Suggestion: If you must use a portable lock-box, bolt it to the floor or chain it to something so it can't be hauled away. Don't count on hiding your lock box, better to use a safe deposit box.

Burglar: "All these rich folks have some guns. I can get a mess of drugs for a gun! I'll just dump all the drawers until I find one!" Suggestion: Always keep firearms locked in a secure place, such as a gun safe. Convicted felons pay big bucks for a gun on the street.

Burglar: "Last night there were two cars in front of this house, now they're both gone. I can take my time going through this place!" Suggestion: If your house is left unoccupied regularly, such as when everyone leaves for work and school, consider an alarm system. And make sure they put an obvious sign in front of your house to warn potential burglars.

Shift gears. Think like a burglar. Then take a few minutes to make some changes around your house.
