Occasionally, it is necessary to repeat a previously published article. With the return of spring, many of our neighbors have noted a growth in hedges in yards. The civic league board has received expressions of concern and opted to re-run this article from last year:

KNOW YOUR CITY CODE...

BLIND CORNERS

I frequently get asked what can be done about dangerous "blind" intersections in our neighborhood. There are clear standards in article 2, section 201 of the VB City Zoning Ordinance.


Visibility at the intersection of driveways and streets can NOT be blocked by any hedge or structure higher than 30 inches. This applies to a triangle area 20 feet from any intersection or 10 feet from a driveway,

If you are concerned about an intersection, first check if fences or shrubs in the "visibility triangle" violate the 30 inch rule. If they do, please bring it to the attention of the property owner - you will be doing them a favor, since very few people are aware of this rule. If the owner is unable to trim or remove the hazard, you might volunteer to help them. If the owner is unwilling to do anything, you could report it to the VB City Public Works department.

Property owners, please check your corners and help us prevent any tragic vehicle / pedestrian accidents in the neighborhood.


Just found my favorite music WHRO HD 90.3-3

EASTER EGG HUNT RE-CAP

Lots of Eggs for Small Group Attending the Annual Civic League Easter Egg Hunt

Threats of wind and showers didn't keep away a small but eager crowd of Pembroke neighborhood children who scampered like bunnies to find the Easter Eggs at the April 16th event in the Pembroke Meadows Wayside Park.

The Easter Egg Hunt is sponsored annually by the Pembroke Meadows, Shores and Townhomes Civic League and organized by Vivian Hance, with help from her family and local students, plus an appearance by her husband Merril Hance dressed as the Easter Bunny.

Activities started with face painting, temporary tattoos, stickers and time to play on the swings and slides in the park. Parents with cameras had plenty of photo-ops of their children with the Easter Bunny. Then the big event: Hunting for plastic Easter Eggs with candy treats inside. This was divided by age into three groups. Toddlers had one area where the eggs were in plain sight; pre-school children had to look a bit harder in their designated area; and finally, the older boys and girls had to look under leaves and behind logs to find their eggs. Because of the smaller numbers than in some years, everyone found plenty of eggs. One lucky hunter in each group found a special prize in their egg.

YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD INFORMATION

Welcome to your new neighborhood. We have a lot to offer you and your family.

Our schools are top rated, shopping is close by, and medical facilities, 3rd precinct police station, Davis Corner Fire and Rescue Departments are mere minutes from your door.

At the end of Pembroke Blvd. you will find a **small city park** with swings, slides, playground equipment along with picnic tables and a lovely peaceful view.

The **Pembroke Meadows Recreations Center** pool is also at the end of Pembroke Blvd. and you and your family are welcome to join the pool in time for summer fun.

Our **CIVIC LEAGUE** meets in the media room on the **3rd Thursday** of the month at Pembroke Meadows
Elementary School on Cathedral Drive. We do not meet in the summer or in December.

Our Annual Civic League Dues per household is \$10.00. Your dues cover the printing costs of our monthly neighborhood newsletter, meeting expenses, plantings along the entrance median, flag replacements as needed, electrical expense for median lighting, upkeep and replacement of our Gazebo at the entrance, Easter Egg Hunt for children, Halloween Walk and refreshments for all ages, along with support for Girls Scouts, Boy Scouts, Garden Club, and other expenses necessary to our community. There are no paid employees and we depend solely on neighborhood volunteers to accomplish our programs. So be sure to mail in your dues promptly.

<u>Lost Pet Program</u>. We have a free lost and found pet program open to our residents.

Simply complete a form and attach a picture of your pet then mail the form to the address on the form. Make sure your pet has some form of identification or tag. Be sure to also sign up for the Neighborhood Notification List. Lost Pet Forms are available on our web site www.pembrokemeadows.org. Be sure to contact Jim Hall about getting on the email notification list. This is very important if you have pets.

Neighborhood Email Notification List - This program, once you have asked to be included by contacting Jim Hall at 473-8258, will enable you to receive email information regarding upcoming Civic League Meetings or cancellations, events occurring in the community and announcements of Lost or Found pets. It will also serve to inform you of events or incidents that may occur that you should be made aware of in the event of emergencies.

Garbage & Recycle Days- Garbage is picked up every WEDNESDAY. Recycles are picked up every other Wednesday. Just look for blue cans that have been put out by your neighbors. Yard waste is picked up weekly on Wednesday. (Please remember though if the city refuse departments do not retrieve your yard waste, YOU are responsible for removing it from the curb and proper disposal.)

Remember we can always use volunteers. We hope you will get involved.
