

HALLOWEEN WALK UPDATE


The 21st Annual Halloween Walk will be held Saturday, October 29th at 3:00 p.m. We need volunteers!! Folks willing to:

- Donate juice, cookies, or cash







It is amazing to me how quickly the summer has flown by. Another successful pool season has passed with even more improvements to the facility. The swim team won the divisional meet. A Labor Day cook out rounded out the summer.

This month marks 22 years keeping residence in our Pembroke Meadows hamlet. 22 years of raising children and building relationships with neighbors. I look back on our time here and realize how blessed we are to live in this neighborhood. Other subdivisions may have nicer homes, better views, be more convenient to shopping, or boast a more active/influential civic league. But it is not the size or quality of the structure that matters, or the view, or the shopping, or what a civic league can convince city government to do. What matters are the people who are your neighbors. We have found a little piece of heaven here in Pembroke Meadows. Neighbors have become friends whom we have shared meals with, confided in, celebrated accomplishments with, commiserated with, grieved losses with, and consoled in times of need. Now that the school year has commenced, a new cycle of civic league meetings begins: third Thursday of September, October, November, January, February, March, April and May. Attendance is usually the same 20 or so folks out of 600+ households. I attribute that to folks being content with the status quo and having other priorities; I get that. It wasn't until my kids were out of the house that I regularly attended the meetings. However, if you have neighborhood concerns, a civic league meeting is a welcome forum to share that issue.

The civic league serves as point on several activities. Most recently, there was National Night Out with the pool open to all residents, serving hotdogs in the basketball area. Coming up on October 29 is the Halloween Walk. It is dedicated neighbors committing to labors of love that allow these events to blossom. Early this past summer, I received a phone call from Dorothy Zeller, with the city's Public Works, asking whether we still wanted upgrades to the lighting in the neighborhood, to include an additional light pole on Pembroke Boulevard at Saint Denis. My answer was yes, but I was curious as to who requested and when. It was ten years ago that civic league president. Travis Little, solicited the improvements. I'm not sure exactly when the installations will occur, but wanted to pass that update on. (Hopefully not another 10 years.) Not to be preachy (well, maybe a little), the neighborhood is what we make it.




PET LOST & FOUND
