
The 21<sup>st</sup> Annual Halloween Walk needs volunteers!! Folks willing to:






Please register your pets in our neighborhood's FREE Pet Lost/Found Registry. Forms and details may be found at <u>www.pembrokemeadows.org</u>.

# BULK ITEM WASTE & YARD DEBRIS PICK-UP

The city will pick up large bulky items with minimum 24 hour notice. You can call (385-4650), email (wastemgt@vbgov.com) or access through the city's website (vbgov.com). While most household items will be collected, they will NOT take construction debris, carpet, doors, cabinets, sinks, rocks, dirt, concrete, glass, vehicle parts or hazardous materials. They will take appliances, but they need notice if the appliance contains freon.

Yard debris is picked up on Wednesday and does not require notification. They will NOT collect limbs greater than 4 feet long or larger than 6 inches in diameter. They should be gathered in bundles not greater than 4 X 4 X 4 feet. They will pick up one bundle per household per week, as well as up to 25 clear plastic bags (not greater than 25 pounds per bag).

If you have more waste than that, a yard debris container can be delivered for \$40 for 24hours by contacting waste management. Additionally, items can be dropped off at the city landfill (1989 Jake Sears Road).


