

MEMORIAL BENCH FOR ROGER VAUGHAN








13 lost pets were returned to owners during November and December.

PRINCESS ANNE COUNTY/ VIRGINIA BEACH HISTORY

The Princess Anne County/Virginia Beach Local History Archive is located at the Meyera E. Oberndorf Central Library. This collection honors, preserves and makes accessible the history of Princess Anne County and Virginia Beach. The archival materials are stored in an access, temperature and humidity controlled room. This non-circulating collection contains local history, family history and genealogical materials donated to the Library. The materials are also digitized and made available on the Internet.

Photographs, scrapbooks, postcards, business records, maps, cookbooks, genealogical papers, et al., that pertain to Princess Anne County and Virginia Beach, are collected and made accessible for others to study and enjoy. Family treasures loaned or donated to the Archives are handled in the way that best fits the desires and needs of the owners:

- Materials which owners are willing to share but want returned to them, are digitized, cataloged, placed on the Library's website and then returned to their owner.
- Materials which are donated to the Library are digitized, cataloged, placed on the Library's website and archived at the MEO Central Library.

To ensure that members of our community are aware of the Princess Anne County/Virginia Beach Local History Archive at the Meyera E. Oberndorf Central Library, I am offering to speak at all civic league meetings, churches and society meetings all over Princess Anne County/Virginia Beach. I would love to discuss the possibility of our working together for the preservation of our local history.
