





ANIMALS IN PAIN

Our January guest speaker was Dr Brian Hastings from Independence Veterinary Hospital.

He talked about indicators of pain and its treatment in animals. Since very few will cry out in pain, the #1 sign is a loss of activity as well as obvious limps or stiffness. If you are given pain meds for your animal, please use them, they can't tell you if they are still hurting. NSAIDS can make a big difference for your older dog's quality of life and joint supplements can help, too. Dr. Hastings advocates good regular exercise, i.e. a walk everyday. Beware becoming a "weekend warrior", your animal may suffer as much as you do.

Referrals are appreciated and they give up to a \$20 credit to the referring party.



It is a 24/7 facility designed to break the cycle of homelessness for single and single pregnant women and their infants. Residents participate full time in productive work. In fact, the core philosophy of Barrett's program is that only through active education, training, and full time employment can a woman become self-sufficient and independent. February Gardening Tips

It may seem like spring is already here with this warm weather, but there are a few chores best done in the month of February. This is the month to prune Crepe Myrtles, Nandinas, Lariope, roses and fruit trees. DO NOT prune anything that flowers in the Spring, such as azaleas and rhododendrons, or you won't have many flowers. It is also the time to start germinating seedlings for Spring planting. If you use dormant oil spray to control insects like tent caterpillars and bag worms, do it this month when the day time temperature gets to a consistent 50 degrees (seems like it's been there for a month!).



Hidden Hazard in Your Home

If you're new to our neighborhood, we have a surprise for you. Almost all the homes in Pembroke Shores, as well as a few in the Meadows, were built with electric wire made of aluminum rather than copper. Under the right circumstances, aluminum wire can be safe. But if not installed and treated properly, it can be a serious fire hazard. Aluminum wire is no longer used in residential construction for this reason.

Many newer electricians have little experience with aluminum wire and may be completely unfamiliar with its problems. That means you have to educate yourself about aluminum wire and be sure you either hire an experienced electrician or use the proper procedures in any do-it-yourself projects.

Unlike copper wire, which is relatively stable, aluminum wire deforms easily, expands and contracts more, is brittle and oxidizes immediately. These characteristics can make a high resistance electrical junction and that means heat. Heat makes everything worse. If a joint becomes hot enough, it can cause a fire.

The number one recommendation by the experts is to replace all aluminum wire with copper. Unfortunately, this is expensive and often extremely difficult. The second recommendation is to hire a certified electrician to use a special tool to bond a copper pigtail to the end of all aluminum wires. However, because there are fewer and fewer homes with aluminum wire, electricians with the equipment and certification have become scarce and therefore, expensive.

Although not a complete cure, there are procedures and hardware that will reduce the risks associated with aluminum wire:

- Always use switches and receptacles rated CO/ALR (Copper/Aluminum Revised). These replace any older fixture rated only CO/AL (Copper/Aluminum). Never use switches or receptacles rated only for CU (Copper). Sadly, there are currently only a few manufacturers and models of CO/ALR devices.
- Always use an anti-oxidant compound on all aluminum wire joints. For example, most electrical suppliers sell Ideal NOALOX and GB Ox-Gard. Better still is a non-flammable anti-oxidant compound called Penetrox A-13 from Burndy, which some experts consider superior. Carefully follow the procedures that come with the product to apply the compound and remove the existing aluminum oxide on the wire.
- Always use wire nuts or splices rated for aluminum to copper. Do not use wire nuts that are only rated for copper (Cu/Cu). Although expensive, these splices provide increased safety for joining aluminum to aluminum or aluminum to copper wire. Look for the "UL Listed" seal as a guide to products that have the materials and construction to reduce the risks

associated with aluminum wire. One product that is UL Listed is "AlumiConn" from King Innovation. These AlumiConn splices are available on line at www.kinginnovation.com, in a 10-pack for \$37.00.

 Never connect stranded copper wire to aluminum wire. If you must make a splice, such as to a ceiling light fixture with stranded wire, make a short pigtail of solid copper wire between the stranded wire and the aluminum wire.

You may be tempted to say "Nothing has happened so far..." but problems in aluminum wire may not develop for years or until an unusually heavy load, such as a hair dryer or portable heater is plugged in. So take a few minutes to make yourself smart and then you can more accurately assess the condition of the wiring in your home. In the meantime, make sure you have fresh batteries in all your smoke detectors.

TAX Corner

Virginia Offers Free Tax Filing Online:

The Virginia Free File program offers taxpayers simple and free options for filing both state and federal tax returns.

What is Free File? The Virginia Free File is a public-private partnership between the Virginia Department of Revenue and electronic tax software companies that donate their online tax preparation and e-filing services to eligible Virginia taxpayers at no cost to the taxpayers or to the Virginia State government. It is based on the IRS Free File program.

Who is Eligible? Approximately 70% of all Virginia taxpayers are eligible to use the brand-name tax software products offered through Free File to prepare and electronically file their federal and state income tax returns online for free. To see if you are eligible, go to www.tax.virginia.gov
