SCOOP THE POOP, Part 2

Many of our neighbors have dogs. Last month we commented on those who did NOT clean up after their dogs, but what about being nice to those who do follow the rules?

To My Neighbors:

My name is Kris Hudson and our family has lived on Whitechapel Drive for almost 9 years. I have 2 large dogs- Charlie, a yellow lab, and Turner, a Catahoula Leopard Dog, and they get walked almost every day. even during hurricanes or snow. I'm sure you have seen either myself or my husband, Sam, out. If you look closely, you will NEVER see us without a bag to "scoop the poop". In fact, we usually carry 4 bags, because they are dogs and you can't predict when, where, or how much they are going to have the urge to go. Today I was yelled at while cleaning up my dog's poop, telling me to let my dog poop in my yard then walk him. Well, I'm sorry, you can't tell a dog to do that. It's called nature, and it will take its course, no matter what I want them to do. And I was doing the RIGHT thing, cleaning up. This "neighbor" continued to harass me, pointing out a pile of another dog's poop, which I then picked up as well. She then said she had the right to yell at me because I was trespassing (I was on the sidewalk- my dog pooped in the median between the sidewalk and the road). So, yes, I then yelled back that I had the right to walk my dogs whenever and wherever I wanted to. I am not proud of yelling back at my elder, but she pushed me too far.

While walking, I have had a Rottweiler crash through a fence at us; and multiple dogs in their front yards (unleashed) confront my dogs, and not once have I complained. I make every effort to switch sides of the street to avoid other dog walkers or if I see a loose dog. I was yelled at by another "neighbor" a few months ago

because my LEASHED, LICENSED and under control dogs barked at her dog while we were 2 houses down and on the other side of the sidewalk. She actually told me to stop walking!

And I agree with the runner (I am one of those as well) that it isn't fun dodging piles on the sidewalk. Yes, we even get dog poop in our front yard, too. But I can't believe how sad it is that I cannot enjoy a nice walk in my own neighborhood without harassment. My dogs may be big but they are on a leash with a harness collar that can't be slipped at all times and NEVER loose in the front yard. 
at 497-5243 to drop them off in her backyard turtle habitat. These turtles do not live in the water.

POLICE TIPS

As part of our Neighborhood Watch we encourage residents to <u>inventory their property</u> in the event that it is stolen. In doing so, you'll be able to give an accurate description on the police report. Make your inventory today! Pictures or video are also a good idea. Not only will inventorying help possibly recover your property if it is stolen, it can be used for insurance purposes in the event of a fire or natural disaster. Keep a running list and add to it each time you purchase something. If you don't want to do a full inventory of everything, at least inventory the items most targeted by burglars. They include...any electronics (TV's, stereos, DVD players, VHS, computers, IPods, gaming systems, etc), jewelry and guns.

Insurance companies may have an inventory form/brochure in which you can record the information. Call them.

<u>Inventory</u>: Make, brand, model, serial number, model number, specific description, where bought, price paid and date purchased. Save receipts too. Again, having the receipt for that 40 inch plasma TV you bought 3 years ago or that brand new HP laptop with all the bells and whistles could help you when filing a claim with your insurance company.

Inventorying your property increases your chances of recovering your property in the event it is stolen.

Lots of Eggs for Small Group Attending the Annual Civic League Easter Egg Hunt
