PRESIDENTIAL PONDERINGS

There has been a rash of burglaries in our neighborhood recently. Two were in the townhouses (July 7 and 16) and one on Hudgins Drive (July 13). The targeted homes gave the appearance that no one was home; most burglars do not want a confrontation with the home owner. One on St. Denis was thwarted by conscientious neighbors who observed something amiss and confronted the miscreants. That is something we should do as good neighbors. If something looks suspicious, don't turn a blind eye. You may have misinterpreted the suspicious person's intentions, but if you speak to that potential burglar so that he (or they) know you have taken notice, then any nefarious intent will likely be suppressed. The Hudgins Drive break-in was preceded by the thief ringing the door bell of a home that had no car in the driveway. The resident, although home, did not answer the door. The burglars then went to the backyard and forced open a dining room window. They were scared away when they realized someone was home, ran across the street, through another backyard, to a car (later reported stolen) parked on Bristol Drive. A chase ensued and the car was abandoned on Minute Men Road; property stolen from another break-in was recovered in that car.

There are several things we can do to make our neighborhood undesirable to burglars and thieves. Mainly, these malcontents do not want to be caught. So anyone suspicious should be looked at and spoken to. If you see someone ringing your neighbor's doorbell and no one answers, ask that visitor whether you can help him/her/them. In determining whether someone belongs or not, it helps to know your neighbors. If you see someone you don't know, say "Hi." Make it known you have seen them. Note their body language; are they trying to be surreptitious? Don't be afraid to call the police with your suspicions. Note descriptions, including any associated vehicle (and hopefully a license plate).

There are other suggestions from the VBPD Crime Prevention Unit:

*keep landscaping trimmed to allow a view of your property by others

*lock your doors; car doors too

*lock/pin windows

*keep an inventory of your property, including serial numbers and credit card numbers *if you leave town, have your neighbors look out for your home

When I was a kid, there was another kid in my neighborhood who stole multiple items from our and nearby neighborhoods. Among the items he illegally acquired were several bicycles, tools and a canoe. His widowed mother never asked about these items and was always satisfied with his explanation that friends had given them to him. My point is that we have to be vigilant about not just suspicious strangers, but keep a check on anything amiss within our own homes.

Our monthly civic league meetings will recommence September 20th at 7 p.m. at Pembroke Meadows Elementary. That meeting will feature information about crime in our friendly hamlet.



Electric Bill Scam Reported

Dominion Virginia Power cautioned customers not to divulge personal information such as a Social Security number or banking information to anyone offering to help them pay their utility bills through a federal program.

According to the <u>Better Business Bureau</u> (BBB), there is no federal program to pay household bills, and providing personal information could lead to identity theft and credit issues.

"Scams are always troubling, especially in these difficult economic times when people are taking advantage of those who may already be struggling to pay their bills," said Gianna Clark, vice president of customer service operations. "We hope this warning will be heeded and shared so that other customers can avoid traps like this."

According to the BBB, victims in states across the country have been contacted by phone, text message, social media and in person. They were asked to "register" their Social Security number and banking information and to make payments using what turns out to be a fake account number.

Dominion encourages anyone who is contacted about a government program proposing to pay utility bills to <u>contact the BBB</u> and local law enforcement officials. Dominion also cautions customers to ask to see an official Dominion ID from anyone who comes to their residence and claims to be from the company.


