- Serve refreshments at the park



TIPS FROM CLIF

Simple Exterior House Cleaning

Our warm, wet Virginia Beach climate seems to encourage green mildew on the North side of our homes. For many, that means dragging out the pressure washer or hiring someone to blast the green away. But there is an easier way.

You can use the same method on the outside of the house that you used in your bathtub for years - bleach. Instead of a power washer, all you need is a standard garden pump sprayer, house detergent from HomeDepot or Lowes and some regular household liquid bleach. Mix it up in the sprayer, spray it onto the green parts of your house, let sit 5 to 10 minutes, then hose it off with water.

An effective detergent is Jomax House Cleaner and Mildew Killer. Follow the instructions on the container to mix and use the Jomax, bleach and water. Rubber gloves are recommended and be sure to wear eye protection. Prior to use, wet down your flowers, shrubs and grass with water to protect them from the bleach.

This solution is safe for most vinyl siding, brick and exterior painted surfaces, but test it on a small area to be sure. You'll need a ladder to reach the upper parts of your house. A simple hose nozzle makes it easy to wash off all areas with water once the bleach has done its job. Unlike pressure washers, low pressure water from the hose won't penetrate under the siding or chip paint.






Visit The NEW Williams Farm Recreation Center

The Williams Farm Recreation Center will hold the Official Ribbon Cutting and Ceremony on Friday, October 26th, at 4:00 pm.


This NEW community recreation center is a 70,993 square foot facility with amenities to include:
