



While most of us know not to pour cooking fats, oil or grease down the kitchen drain and to dry wipe pans and dishes before washing, we learned some other surprising sources of fats at the April meeting. The only milk that can go down the drain is skim milk and any cake type batters, salad dressings, sauces, peanut butter or any dairy product containing fat should also not go down the drain or garbage disposal.

Kate Nixon also shared with us that if your water tastes or looks funny, you can call 385-1400 and the city will tell you if anything is happening in your neighborhood and can also come out and test your water and flush the lines if needed.

If you have a pet and have not competed a form, please do as soon as possible. Dogs will be heading out doors with the warm weather and getting lost. I need identification on the dog, a completed form filled out and sent to me. 

# Just "Don't" Do It Protect our Honey Bees

Your diet depends on it!

Every Spring-Summer, Mother Nature encourages the colony to divide and create another colony of honeybees. The Queen and about ½ her daughters leave the hive searching for a new home. This cluster may gather on a tree branch, a bush, your mailbox, even the picnic table in your backyard while awaiting directions from the scout bees of their new address. This is the natural way honeybees reproduce to ensure their continued survival. PLEASE do not spray insecticide and kill this vital natural resource. Approximately 80 crops in Virginia rely heavily on honeybees for pollination. Reduce the number of honeybees and we significantly reduce the availability and affordability of fruits and vegetables in our homes. Homeowners and Business Owners spraying honeybees has an immediate and long lasting effect on our ability to produce the food crops we all enjoy and want in our diet.

The safe and most responsible thing to do if you see a swarm of honeybees is call Tidewater Beekeepers Association. For FREE, they will send a beekeeper to your home to collect these bees and place them in a hive where the bees will continue to collect pollen, pollinate our fruits and vegetables and make honey.

## **Amazing Honeybee Facts**

Foragers are the oldest worker bees in a hive and are the only bees that most people ever see going from flower to flower. These bees are all females and make up the largest number of bees in the colony. They forage for food (pollen and nectar), build and protect the hive, clean, circulate air by beating their wings, and perform many other societal functions.

It takes about 556 worker bees traveling over 55,000 miles visiting 2 million flowers to gather enough nectar to make 1 pound of honey.

The average worker honeybee makes 1/12 of a teaspoon of honey in her lifetime. That is 5 drops of honey!

Honey is used by the bees for food all year round. There are many types, colors and flavors of honey, depending upon the nectar source. The bees make honey from the nectar they collect from flowering trees and plants. Honey is an easily digestible, pure food. Honey is hydroscopic and has antibacterial qualities. Eating local honey is thought by many to fend off allergies.

Bee Venom: the "ouch factor" most people remember, is likely a bad experience with a wasp and not a honeybee. Although sharp pain and some swelling and itching are natural reactions to a honeybee sting, only a very small percentage of individuals are highly allergic to bee venom. "Bee venom therapy" is widely practiced overseas and by some in the USA to address health problems such as arthritis, high blood pressure, high cholesterol and even MS.
