WHAT IS THE LOST PET PROGRAM AND HOW DOES IT WORK?

When a pet in our neighborhood has been found, a call goes out to our Coordinator - Gerry Richter. The pet is either kept at the location found or turned over to Gerry. A check of completed Lost Pet forms is initiated if no identification is found on the pet.

A description of the pet is then sent to Jim & Clera Hall. They send out the report to all those that have signed up to be included in the Neighborhood email Notification List Program. This program has proved highly successful in locating the owner and a prompt pet return is made.

We also keep the lost pet program phone numbers by the message board in the median strip for additional quick reference.

If your pet has identification, a quick call can be made to you and you can pick up your frightened pet immediately.

The program is FREE. We ask only that you send in a completed pet information form (located on our website) with a picture attached. And don't forget to put identification on your pet.

Cats that have gotten out are highly intelligent and quickly find their way home. Dogs –not so much.

What happens to an unclaimed pet? It is turned over to Animal Control.

If you have a pet, please get on the program today if you have not already signed up.

Summer brings thunderstorms and frightened pets that manage to escape their homes. Please put identification on your pet. Be sure to check our neighborhood email notification list also. We list found and lost pets as soon and we get information. A total of 9 pets have been reunited this past month.


As a rule, however, the most value returned from renovating a home comes in the kitchen (no surprise to those that watch HGTV). According to one national survey, kitchen remodels returned an average 88% of the investment. Bathrooms came in second, returning 85%. Keep in mind that this is one survey and overimproving for a home or neighborhood may not result in these same returns.

About Those Turtles

BOX TURTLES have colorful designs on their shells. A fully grown adult BOX TURTLE is the size of a Round butter container. The shell is higher and rounded.

WATER TURTLES, have rather plain colored shells ranging from greyish, brown, black and even green if covered in algae. They can grow to be huge in size perhaps 2 feet across. They tend to be more oblong in shape with long "nails" and webbing between their toes. I don't recommend you check for this as they bite. Female water turtles are now coming out of the water to lay eggs in yards. They will return to the water so you can leave them alone.

While I will gladly take in box turtles that roam in the streets and are endangered by vehicles I do not take in water turtles. The box turtles living in the back yard have a great life and the perfect habitat that includes both natural and supplemented food along with plenty of water and hiding places. Some even come up to the back door for feeding and bathing.


